HOUSE RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, Autism spectrum disorders can affect all individuals regardless of racial, ethnic, economic, and social groups; and

5 WHEREAS, About 1 in 6 children in the United States had a 6 developmental disability in the period of 2006-2008, ranging 7 from mild disabilities such as speech and language impairments 8 to serious developmental disabilities, such as intellectual 9 disabilities, cerebral palsy, and autism; and

- 10 WHEREAS, Autism spectrum disorders are more common than 11 pediatric cancer, diabetes, and AIDS combined; and
- 12 WHEREAS, Studies in Asia, Europe, and North America have 13 identified individuals with an autism spectrum disorder, with 14 an average prevalence of about 1%; a recent study in South 15 Korea reported a prevalence of 2.6%; and
- WHEREAS, About 1 in 88 children has been identified with an autism spectrum disorder, according to estimates from CDC's Autism and Developmental Disabilities Monitoring Network; and
- 19 WHEREAS, The cause of autism spectrum disorders is still unknown, but research strongly suggests that it is caused by

- 1 certain factors that affect brain development; and
- 2 WHEREAS, Autism spectrum disorders have increased tenfold
- 3 in the last decade and now occurs in some form in 1 in 54 boys
- 4 in the United States; and
- 5 WHEREAS, Autism, which is five times more common among boys
- 6 than girls, usually appears during the first three years of
- 7 life; and
- 8 WHEREAS, Early diagnosis, research, training, education,
- 9 and therapies are vital to reducing the effects of autism; and
- 10 WHEREAS, Current research suspects that there is not a
- 11 single cause that will ultimately be discovered, but rather a
- 12 cluster of factors which include genetics, pregnancy/birth
- 13 complications, viral infections, metabolic disorders,
- 14 congenital anomaly syndrome (birth defects), and environmental
- 15 toxins; therefore, be it
- 16 RESOLVED, BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE
- 17 NINETY-EIGHTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, that
- 18 we designate the date of April 17, 2013 as Autism Day in the
- 19 State of Illinois for the purpose of urging both government
- 20 entities and the citizenry to become aware and educated on the
- 21 subject of autism spectrum disorders.
