## Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, represented in the General Assembly:

No contract shall be entered into or obligation incurred for repairs and maintenance and other capital improvements from appropriations made in Sections 5 and 40 of this Article until after the purposes and amounts have been approved in writing by the Governor.

2 ARTICLE 1.1

3 Section 1. The amount of \$100,000, or so much thereof as 4 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Sex Offender 5 Management Board Fund to the Sex Offender Management Board for the purposes authorized by the Sex Offender Management 6 Board Act including, but not limited to, sex offender 7 8 evaluation, treatment, and monitoring programs and grants. 9 Funding received from private sources is to be expended in 10 accordance with the terms and conditions placed upon the 11 funding.

Section 99. Effective date. This Act takes effect July 1, 2013.
