SYNOPSIS AS INTRODUCED:

Amends "An Act making appropriations" (Public Act 98-50). Increases the amount appropriated to Grundy County for operating assistance grants from \$278,300 to \$428,300. Effective immediately.

2 **Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, represented**
3 **in the General Assembly:**

4 Section 5. "An Act making appropriations", Public Act 98-
5 50, approved July 2, 2013, is amended by changing Section 250
6 of Article 22 as follows:

7 (P.A. 98-50, Article 22, Section 250)

8 Sec. 250. The following named sums, or so much thereof
9 as may be necessary, are appropriated from the Downstate
10 Public Transportation Fund to the Department of
11 Transportation for operating assistance grants to provide a
12 portion of the eligible operating expenses for the following
13 carriers for the purposes stated in Article II of Public Act
14 78-1109, as amended:
