WHEREAS, Royce Elliott graduated from Woodruff High School, where he played baseball, basketball, and football and participated in choir; he later attended Western Illinois University, where he played football and baseball, and Bradley University; and

WHEREAS, Royce Elliott was best known as "America's funniest clean comedian"; he traveled all over North America performing as an emcee for sports, corporate, and charity events; he entertained at numerous venues, such as Bally's Las Vegas, The Grand Ole Opry, and Atlantic City; he also performed his routine at the Stadium Club in Peoria, Two Brother's Tap, and local baseball fields; and

WHEREAS, Royce Elliott made dozens of national television appearances on "The Ralph Emery Show", "Crook and Chase",

1 "Nashville Now", and "The Statler Brothers Show"; he worked
2 with many celebrities, including Frank Sinatra, Lou Rawls, Rich
3 Little, Barbara Mandrell, Vince Gill, and Conway Twitty; he
4 also worked sports banquets and fantasy camps with sports stars
5 Lou Brock, Bob Gibson, Fergie Jenkins, Terry Bradshaw, Jack
6 Buck, Harry Caray, and many others; and

7 WHEREAS, After semi-retiring, Royce Elliott worked locally
8 as a co-host of "Breakfast With Royce and Roger", where he
9 connected with his all-time favorite comedian, Jonathan
10 Winters; he spent most Thursday mornings at the Sterling Family
11 Restaurant with good friends from the ROMEO club; and

12 WHEREAS, Royce Elliott enjoyed sports and coaching and
13 sponsoring local teams; he played for several years in the
14 Peoria Sunday Morning League and played fast pitch softball for
15 about 20 years; Elliott's Jesters sponsored fast pitch teams,
16 park district men's basketball teams, and youth track teams; he
17 also coached in the Salvation Army Bidy Basketball league and
18 West Peoria Little League; and

19 WHEREAS, Royce Elliott was preceded in death by his
20 parents; his daughter, Rhonda Elizabeth Elliott; and his
