1 AN ACT concerning safety.

## 2 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, 3 represented in the General Assembly:

4 Section 5. The Illinois Solid Waste Management Act is 5 amended by changing Section 3 as follows:

6 (415 ILCS 20/3) (from Ch. 111 1/2, par. 7053)

Sec. 3. State agency materials recycling program.

8 (a) All State agencies responsible for the maintenance of 9 public lands in the State shall, to the maximum extent 10 feasible, use compost materials in all land maintenance 11 activities which are to be paid with public funds.

12 (a-5) All State agencies responsible for the maintenance of 13 public lands in the State shall review its procurement 14 specifications and policies to determine (1) if incorporating compost materials will help reduce stormwater run-off and 15 increase infiltration of moisture in land maintenance 16 17 activities and (2) the current recycled content usage and potential for additional recycled content usage by the Agency 18 19 in land maintenance activities and report to the General Assembly by December 15, 2015. 20

(b) The Department of Central Management Services, in
 coordination with the Department of Commerce and Economic
 Opportunity, shall implement waste reduction programs,

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separation and collection, for 1 including source office wastepaper, corrugated containers, newsprint and mixed paper, 2 in all State buildings as appropriate and feasible. Such waste 3 programs shall be designed to achieve 4 reduction waste 5 reductions of at least 25% of all such waste by December 31, 6 1995, and at least 50% of all such waste by December 31, 2000. 7 Any source separation and collection program shall include, at 8 a minimum, procedures for collecting and storing recyclable 9 materials, bins or containers for storing materials, and 10 contractual or other arrangements with buyers of recyclable 11 materials. If market conditions so warrant, the Department of 12 Management Services, in coordination with Central the 13 Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity, may modify 14 programs developed pursuant to this Section.

15 The Department of Commerce and Community Affairs (now 16 Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity) shall conduct 17 waste categorization studies of all State facilities for 18 calendar years 1991, 1995 and 2000. Such studies shall be 19 designed to assist the Department of Central Management 20 Services to achieve the waste reduction goals established in 21 this subsection.

(c) Each State agency shall, upon consultation with the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity, periodically review its procurement procedures and specifications related to the purchase of products or supplies. procuring agency to seek out products and supplies that contain 1 2 recycled materials, and to ensure that purchased products or 3 supplies are reusable, durable or made from recycled materials whenever economically and practically feasible. In choosing 4 among products or supplies that contain recycled material, 5 consideration shall be given to products and supplies with the 6 7 highest recycled material content that is consistent with the 8 effective and efficient use of the product or supply.

9 (d) Wherever economically and practically feasible, the 10 Department of Central Management Services shall procure 11 recycled paper and paper products as follows:

(1) Beginning July 1, 1989, at least 10% of the total
dollar value of paper and paper products purchased by the
Department of Central Management Services shall be
recycled paper and paper products.

16 (2) Beginning July 1, 1992, at least 25% of the total
17 dollar value of paper and paper products purchased by the
18 Department of Central Management Services shall be
19 recycled paper and paper products.

(3) Beginning July 1, 1996, at least 40% of the total
dollar value of paper and paper products purchased by the
Department of Central Management Services shall be
recycled paper and paper products.

(4) Beginning July 1, 2000, at least 50% of the total
dollar value of paper and paper products purchased by the
Department of Central Management Services shall be

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1 recycled paper and paper products.

(e) Paper and paper products purchased from private vendors pursuant to printing contracts are not considered paper products for the purposes of subsection (d). However, the Department of Central Management Services shall report to the General Assembly on an annual basis the total dollar value of printing contracts awarded to private sector vendors that included the use of recycled paper.

9 (f)(1) Wherever economically and practically feasible, the 10 recycled paper and paper products referred to in subsection 11 (d) shall contain postconsumer recovered or paper 12 specified by paper category materials as in this 13 subsection:

(i) Recycled high grade printing and writing paper 14 15 shall contain at least 50% recovered paper material. Such recovered paper material, until July 1, 1994, 16 17 shall consist of at least 20% deinked stock or postconsumer material; and beginning July 1, 1994, 18 shall consist of at least 25% deinked stock or 19 20 postconsumer material; and beginning July 1, 1996, shall consist of at least 30% deinked stock or 21 22 postconsumer material; and beginning July 1, 1998, 23 shall consist of at least 40% deinked stock or postconsumer material; and beginning July 1, 2000, 24 25 shall consist of at least 50% deinked stock or 26 postconsumer material.

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(ii) Recycled tissue products, until July 1, 1994, 1 2 shall contain at least 25% postconsumer material; and beginning July 1, 1994, shall contain at least 30% 3 postconsumer material; and beginning July 1, 1996, 4 5 shall contain at least 35% postconsumer material; and beginning July 1, 1998, shall contain at least 40% 6 7 postconsumer material; and beginning July 1, 2000, shall contain at least 45% postconsumer material. 8

9 (iii) Recycled newsprint, until July 1, 1994, 10 shall contain at least 40% postconsumer material; and 11 beginning July 1, 1994, shall contain at least 50% 12 postconsumer material; and beginning July 1, 1996, 13 shall contain at least 60% postconsumer material; and 14 beginning July 1, 1998, shall contain at least 70% 15 postconsumer material; and beginning July 1, 2000, 16 shall contain at least 80% postconsumer material.

17 (iv) Recycled unbleached packaging, until July 1, least 35% postconsumer 1994, shall contain at 18 19 material; and beginning July 1, 1994, shall contain at 20 least 40% postconsumer material; and beginning July 1, 1996, shall 21 contain at least 45% postconsumer 22 material; and beginning July 1, 1998, shall contain at 23 least 50% postconsumer material; and beginning July 1, 24 2000, shall contain at least 55% postconsumer 25 material.

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(v) Recycled paperboard, until July 1, 1994, shall

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1 contain at least 80% postconsumer material; and 2 beginning July 1, 1994, shall contain at least 85% 3 postconsumer material; and beginning July 1, 1996, 4 shall contain at least 90% postconsumer material; and 5 beginning July 1, 1998, shall contain at least 95% 6 postconsumer material.

7 (2) For the purposes of this Section, "postconsumer
8 material" includes:

9 (i) paper, paperboard, and fibrous wastes from 10 retail stores, office buildings, homes, and so forth, 11 after the waste has passed through its end usage as a 12 consumer item, including used corrugated boxes, old 13 newspapers, mixed waste paper, tabulating cards, and 14 used cordage; and

(ii) all paper, paperboard, and fibrous wastes
that are diverted or separated from the municipal solid
waste stream.

18 (3) For the purposes of this Section, "recovered paper19 material" includes:

20

(i) postconsumer material;

(ii) dry paper and paperboard waste generated after completion of the papermaking process (that is, those manufacturing operations up to and including the cutting and trimming of the paper machine reel into smaller rolls or rough sheets), including envelope cuttings, bindery trimmings, and other paper and HB1362 Engrossed - 7 - LRB099 05925 MGM 25973 b

paperboard waste resulting from printing, cutting,
 forming, and other converting operations, or from bag,
 box and carton manufacturing, and butt rolls, mill
 wrappers, and rejected unused stock; and

5 (iii) finished paper and paperboard from obsolete 6 inventories of paper and paperboard manufacturers, 7 merchants, wholesalers, dealers, printers, converters, 8 or others.

9 (g) The Department of Central Management Services may adopt 10 regulations to carry out the provisions and purposes of this 11 Section.

(h) Every State agency shall, in its procurement documents, specify that, whenever economically and practically feasible, a product to be procured must consist, wholly or in part, of recycled materials, or be recyclable or reusable in whole or in part. When applicable, if state guidelines are not already prescribed, State agencies shall follow USEPA guidelines for federal procurement.

19 (i) All State agencies shall cooperate with the Department 20 of Central Management Services in carrying out this Section. 21 The Department of Central Management Services may enter into 22 cooperative purchasing agreements with other governmental 23 units in order to obtain volume discounts, or for other reasons in accordance with the Governmental Joint Purchasing Act, or in 24 25 accordance with the Intergovernmental Cooperation Act if 26 governmental units of other states or the federal government HB1362 Engrossed - 8 - LRB099 05925 MGM 25973 b

1 are involved.

2 (j) The Department of Central Management Services shall 3 submit an annual report to the General Assembly concerning its implementation of the State's collection and recycled paper 4 5 procurement programs. This report shall include a description 6 of the actions that the Department of Central Management 7 Services has taken in the previous fiscal year to implement 8 this Section. This report shall be submitted on or before 9 November 1 of each year.

10 (k) The Department of Central Management Services, in 11 cooperation with all other appropriate departments and 12 agencies of the State, shall institute whenever economically 13 and practically feasible the use of re-refined motor oil in all State-owned motor vehicles and the use of remanufactured and 14 retread tires whenever such use is practical, beginning no 15 16 later than July 1, 1992.

17 (l) (Blank).

The Department of Central Management Services, in 18 (m) 19 coordination with the Department of Commerce and Community 20 Affairs (now Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity), shall implement an aluminum can recycling program in all State 21 22 buildings within 270 days of the effective date of this 23 amendatory Act of 1997. The program shall provide for (1) the collection and storage of used aluminum cans in bins or other 24 25 appropriate containers made reasonably available to occupants 26 and visitors of State buildings and (2) the sale of used HB1362 Engrossed - 9 - LRB099 05925 MGM 25973 b

1 aluminum cans to buyers of recyclable materials.

Proceeds from the sale of used aluminum cans shall be deposited into I-CYCLE accounts maintained in the State Surplus Property Revolving Fund and, subject to appropriation, shall be used by the Department of Central Management Services and any other State agency to offset the costs of implementing the aluminum can recycling program under this Section.

8 All State agencies having an aluminum can recycling program 9 in place shall continue with their current plan. If a State 10 agency has an existing recycling program in place, proceeds 11 from the aluminum can recycling program may be retained and 12 distributed pursuant to that program, otherwise all revenue 13 resulting from these programs shall be forwarded to Central 14 Management Services, I-CYCLE for placement into the 15 appropriate account within the State Surplus Property 16 Revolving Fund, minus any operating costs associated with the 17 program.
