1 AMENDMENT TO HOUSE BILL 1779 2 AMENDMENT NO. . Amend House Bill 1779 by replacing everything after the enacting clause with the following: 3 "Section 5. The School Code is amended by renumbering and 4 changing Section 2-3.160, added by Public Act 98-705, and by 5 6 adding Section 27-23.11 as follows: 7 (105 ILCS 5/2-3.161) Sec. 2-3.161 2-3.160. Definition of dyslexia in rules; 8 9 reading instruction advisory group. 10 (a) The State Board of Education shall adopt rules that 11

- incorporate an international definition of dyslexia into Part 226 of Title 23 of the Illinois Administrative Code.
- 13 Subject to specific State appropriation or the availability of private donations, the State Board of Education 14 15 shall establish an advisory group to develop a training module or training modules to provide education and professional 16

- 1 development to teachers, school administrators, and other
- 2 education professionals regarding multi-sensory, systematic,
- and sequential instruction in reading. This advisory group 3
- 4 shall complete its work before December 15 <del>July 31</del>, 2015 and is
- 5 abolished on December 15 July 31, 2015.

- 8 Sec. 27-23.11. Screening. School districts shall be
- 9 required to screen all students enrolled in kindergarten and
- 10 grade one in the following components of letter naming, letter
- sound, phoneme segmentation, phonemic awareness, and rapid 11
- 12 naming. School districts shall evaluate each student's family
- 13 history of learning disabilities. School districts shall be
- 14 required to screen all students enrolled in grade 2 in the
- components of oral reading fluency, oral reading accuracy, and 15
- spelling. School districts may include additional components 16
- in each screening. If a student demonstrates a deficiency in 17
- any one or more of the components screened, then that student 18
- 19 may be provided evidence-based instruction through a
- multi-tiered system of support. Parents and guardians of 20
- 21 students must be informed of the results of screenings required
- 22 under this Section.
- 23 Section 99. Effective date. This Act takes effect upon
- 24 becoming law.".
