#### SYNOPSIS AS INTRODUCED:

625 ILCS 5/6-110.1				

Amends the Illinois Notary Public Act. Provides that the Secretary of State may establish and maintain an online application system that permits an Illinois resident to apply for appointment and commission as a notary public. Sets forth a list of required information that must be contained in an online application. Requires the online application system to employ security measures and automatically send confirmation messages by electronic mail upon receipt of an application and verification of an applicant's information in the Secretary of State's driver's license and Illinois Identification Card databases. Provides that an online applicant shall swear and affirm the oath electronically. Allows the Secretary of State to conduct a verification on all notary public applications. Amends the Illinois Vehicle Code. Allows the Secretary of State to release photographs and signatures obtained in the process of issuing a driver's license, permit, or identification card to officers and employees of the Secretary who have a need to have access to the stored images for purposes of issuing and controlling notary public commissions and for the purpose of providing the signatures required to process online applications for appointment and commission as notaries public.

# 2 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, 3 represented in the General Assembly:

4 Section 5. The Illinois Notary Public Act is amended by 5 changing Sections 2-102 and 2-104 and by adding Section 2-102.5 6 as follows:

7 (5 ILCS 312/2-102) (from Ch. 102, par. 202-102)

8 Sec. 2-102. Application. Every applicant for appointment 9 and commission as a notary shall complete an application <u>in a</u> 10 <u>format prescribed</u> form furnished by the Secretary of State to 11 be filed with the Secretary of State, stating:

12 (a) the applicant's official name, <u>as it appears on his or</u> 13 <u>her current driver's license or state-issued identification</u> 14 <u>card</u> which contains his or her last name and at least the 15 <u>initial of the first name</u>;

16 (b) the county in which the applicant resides or, if the 17 applicant is a resident of a state bordering Illinois, the 18 county in Illinois in which that person's principal place of 19 work or principal place of business is located;

(c) the applicant's residence address, as it appears on his
 or her current driver's license or state-issued identification
 <u>card</u>, and business address, if any, or any address at which an
 applicant will use a notary public commission to receive fees;

1 (d) that the applicant has resided in the State of Illinois 2 for 30 days preceding the application or that the applicant who 3 is a resident of a state bordering Illinois has worked or 4 maintained a business in Illinois for 30 days preceding the 5 application;

6 (e) that the applicant is a citizen of the United States or 7 an alien lawfully admitted for permanent residence in the 8 United States;

9 (f) <u>the applicant's date of birth</u> that the applicant is at 10 <del>least 18 years of age</del>;

11 (g) that the applicant is able to read and write the 12 English language;

13 (h) that the applicant has never been the holder of a 14 notary public appointment that was revoked or suspended during 15 the past 10 years;

16 (i) that the applicant has not been convicted of a felony; 17 and

18 <u>(i-5) that the applicant's signature authorizes the Office</u> 19 of the Secretary of State to conduct a verification to confirm 20 <u>the information provided in the application; and</u>

21 (j) any other information the Secretary of State deems 22 necessary.

25 Sec. 2-102.5. Online notary public application system.

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1	(a) The Secretary of State may establish and maintain an
2	online application system that permits an Illinois resident to
3	apply for appointment and commission as a notary public.
4	(b) Any such online notary public application system shall
5	employ security measures to ensure the accuracy and integrity
6	of notary public applications submitted electronically under
7	this Section.
8	(c) The Secretary of State may cross reference information
9	provided by applicants with that contained in the Secretary of
10	State's driver's license and Illinois Identification Card
11	databases in order to match the information submitted by
12	applicants, and may receive from those databases the
13	applicant's digitized signature upon a successful match of the
14	applicant's information with that information contained in the
15	<u>databases.</u>
16	(d) An online notary public application shall contain all
17	of the information that is required for a paper application as
18	provided in Section 2-102 of this Act. The applicant shall also
19	be required to provide:
20	(1) the applicant's full Illinois driver's license or
21	Illinois Identification Card number;
22	(2) the date of issuance of the Illinois driver's
23	license or Illinois Identification Card; and
24	(3) the applicant's e-mail address for notices to be
25	provided under this Section.
26	(e) For his or her application to be accepted, the

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1	applicant shall mark the box associated with the following
2	statement included as part of the online notary public
3	application: "By clicking on the box below, I swear or affirm
4	all of the following:
5	(1) I am the person whose name and identifying
6	information is provided on this form, and I desire to be
7	appointed and commissioned as a notary public in the State
8	<u>of Illinois.</u>
9	(2) All the information I have provided on this form is
10	true and correct as of the date I am submitting this form.
11	(3) I authorize the Secretary of State to utilize my
12	signature on file with the Secretary of State driver's
13	license and Illinois Identification Card databases and
14	understand that such signature will be used on this online
15	notary public application for appointment and commission
16	as a notary public as if I had signed this form
17	personally."
18	(f) Immediately upon receiving a completed online notary
19	public application, the online system shall send by electronic
20	mail a confirmation notice that the application has been
21	received. Upon completion of the procedure outlined in
22	subsection (c) of this Section, the online notary public
23	application system shall send by electronic mail a notice
24	informing the applicant of whether the following information
25	has been matched with the Secretary of State driver's license
26	and Illinois Identification Card databases:

26 <u>and Illinois Identification Card databases:</u>

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1	(1) that the applicant has an authentic Illinois
2	driver's license or Illinois Identification Card issued by
3	the Secretary of State and that the driver's license or
4	Illinois Identification Card number provided by the
5	applicant matches the driver's license or Illinois
6	Identification Card number for that person on file with the
7	Secretary of State;
8	(2) that the date of issuance of the Illinois driver's
9	license or Illinois Identification Card listed on the
10	application matches the date of issuance of that license or
11	card for that person on file with the Secretary of State;
12	(3) that the date of birth provided by the applicant
13	matches the date of birth for that person on file with the
14	Secretary of State; and
15	(4) that the residence address provided by the
16	applicant matches the residence address for that person on
17	file with the Secretary of State.
18	(g) If the information provided by the applicant matches
19	all of the criteria identified in subsection (f) of this
20	Section, the online notary public application system shall
21	retrieve from the Secretary of State's database files an
22	electronic copy of the applicant's signature from his or her
23	Illinois driver's license or Illinois Identification Card and
24	such signature shall be deemed to be the applicant's signature
25	on his or her online notary public application.

2	Sec. 2-104. Oath.

3 <u>(a)</u> Every applicant for appointment and commission as a 4 notary public shall take the following oath in the presence of 5 a person qualified to administer an oath in this State:

6 "I, (name of applicant), solemnly affirm, under the penalty 7 of perjury, that the answers to all questions in this 8 application are true, complete, and correct; that I have 9 carefully read the notary law of this State; and that, if 10 appointed and commissioned as a notary public, I will perform 11 faithfully, to the best of my ability, all notarial acts in 12 accordance with the law.

13 (b) In the event that the applicant completes a paper 14 application for appointment and commission as a notary public, 15 he or she shall take the oath in the presence of a person 16 qualified to administer an oath in this State. The printed oath 17 shall be followed by the signature of the applicant and 18 notarized as follows:

19 ..... (Signature of applicant)

20 Subscribed and affirmed before me on (insert date).

21 ..... (Official signature and official seal 22 of notary)".

23 (c) In the event that the applicant completes an online 24 application for appointment and commission as a notary public, 25 he or she shall affirm the oath electronically. An electronic 26 affirmation of the oath in the online notary public application HB2797

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# 1 system shall have the same force and effect as an oath sworn 2 and affirmed in person.

4 Section 10. The Illinois Vehicle Code is amended by 5 changing Section 6-110.1 as follows:

6 (625 ILCS 5/6-110.1)

7 Sec. 6-110.1. Confidentiality of captured photographs or 8 images. The Secretary of State shall maintain a file on or 9 contract to file all photographs and signatures obtained in the 10 of issuing a driver's license, permit, process or 11 identification card. The photographs and signatures shall be confidential and shall not be disclosed except to the following 12 13 persons:

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(1) the individual upon written request;

15 (2) officers and employees of the Secretary of State 16 who have a need to have access to the stored images for 17 purposes of issuing and controlling driver's licenses, 18 permits, or identification cards;

19 (3) law enforcement officials for a lawful civil or20 criminal law enforcement investigation;

21 (3-5) the State Board of Elections for the sole purpose 22 of providing the signatures required by a local election 23 authority to register a voter through an online voter 24 registration system; or

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1	(3-10) officers and employees of the Secretary of State who
2	have a need to have access to the stored images for purposes of
3	issuing and controlling notary public commissions and for the
4	purpose of providing the signatures required to process online
5	applications for appointment and commission as notaries
6	public; or
7	(4) other entities that the Secretary may exempt by
8	rule.
