### SYNOPSIS AS INTRODUCED:

625 ILCS 5/1-187.001 625 ILCS 5/11-601.5

Amends the Illinois Vehicle Code. Provides that the court has the discretion to determine that a violation of driving at a speed that is 26 or 35 miles per hour or more in excess of the applicable maximum speed limit is not a serious traffic violation and order the clerk of the court to report the finding to the Secretary of State. Makes corresponding changes.

# 2 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, 3 represented in the General Assembly:

Section 5. The Illinois Vehicle Code is amended by changing
Sections 1-187.001 and 11-601.5 as follows:

6 (625 ILCS 5/1-187.001)

7 Sec. 1-187.001. Serious traffic violation.

(a) A conviction when operating a motor vehicle for:

9 (1) a violation of subsection (a) of Section 11-402, 10 relating to a motor vehicle accident involving damage to a 11 vehicle;

(2) a violation of Section 11-403, relating to failure
to stop and exchange information after a motor vehicle
collision, property damage only;

(3) a violation of subsection (a) of Section 11-502, relating to illegal transportation, possession, or carrying of alcoholic liquor within the passenger area of any vehicle;

(4) a violation of Section 6-101 relating to operating
a motor vehicle without a valid license or permit;

(5) a violation of Section 11-403, relating to failure
to stop and exchange information or give aid after a motor
vehicle collision involving personal injury or death;

(6) Except as provided in subsection (c) of Section 1 2 11-601.5, a violation relating to excessive speeding, involving a single speeding charge of 26 miles per hour or 3 more above the legal speed limit; 4 5 (7) a violation relating to reckless driving; (8) a violation of subsection (d) of Section 11-707, 6 7 relating to passing in a no-passing zone; (9) a violation of subsection (b) of Section 11-1402, 8 9 relating to limitations on backing upon a controlled access 10 highway; 11 (10) a violation of subsection (b) of Section 11-707, 12 relating to driving on the left side of a roadway in a 13 no-passing zone; (11) a violation of subsection (e) of Section 11-1002, 14 15 relating to failure to yield the right-of-way to a 16 pedestrian at an intersection; 17 (12) a violation of Section 11-1008, relating to failure to yield to a pedestrian on a sidewalk; or 18 (13) a violation of Section 11-1201, relating to 19 20 failure to stop for an approaching railroad train or 21 railroad track equipment or signals; or 22 (b) Any other similar violation of a law or local ordinance 23 of any state relating to motor vehicle traffic control, other than a parking violation. 24 25 (c) A violation of any of these defined serious traffic 26 offenses shall not preclude the defendant from being eligible

Driving 26 miles per hour or more in excess 6 of applicable limit. 7 (a) A person who drives a vehicle upon any highway of this 8 State at a speed that is 26 miles per hour or more but less than 9 35 miles per hour in excess of the applicable maximum speed 10 limit established under this Chapter or a local ordinance 11 commits a Class B misdemeanor. 12 (b) A person who drives a vehicle upon any highway of this State at a speed that is 35 miles per hour or more in excess of 13 14 the applicable maximum speed limit established under this Chapter or a local ordinance commits a Class A misdemeanor. 15 16 (c) The court has the discretion to determine that a violation of this Section is not a serious traffic violation 17 18 and order the clerk of the court to report the finding to the 19 Secretary of State.
