### SYNOPSIS AS INTRODUCED:

Amends the Illinois Vehicle Code. Provides that the State Police (currently, the Department of Transportation) shall be the lead and sole agency to administer the Federal Motor Carrier Safety Administration Motor Carrier Safety Assistance Program and receive its related grants. Amends the State Finance Act and the Illinois Hazardous Materials Transportation Act to make conforming changes. Effective July 1, 2015.

# 2 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, 3 represented in the General Assembly:

Section 5. The State Finance Act is amended by changing
Section 8.3 as follows:

6 (30 ILCS 105/8.3) (from Ch. 127, par. 144.3)

7 Sec. 8.3. Money in the Road Fund shall, if and when the 8 State of Illinois incurs any bonded indebtedness for the 9 construction of permanent highways, be set aside and used for the purpose of paying and discharging annually the principal 10 and interest on that bonded indebtedness then due and payable, 11 12 and for no other purpose. The surplus, if any, in the Road Fund 13 after the payment of principal and interest on that bonded 14 indebtedness then annually due shall be used as follows:

15 first -- to pay the cost of administration of Chapters 16 2 through 10 of the Illinois Vehicle Code, except the cost 17 of administration of Articles I and II of Chapter 3 of that 18 Code; and

19 secondly -- for expenses of the Department of 20 for construction, Transportation reconstruction, 21 improvement, repair, maintenance, operation, and 22 of highways in accordance administration with the provisions of laws relating thereto, or for any purpose 23

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related or incident to and connected therewith, including 1 2 the separation of grades of those highways with railroads 3 and with highways and including the payment of awards made by the Illinois Workers' Compensation Commission under the 4 terms of the Workers' Compensation Act or 5 Workers' Occupational Diseases Act for injury or 6 death of an 7 employee of the Division of Highways in the Department of 8 Transportation; or for the acquisition of land and the 9 erection of buildings for highway purposes, including the 10 acquisition of highway right-of-way or for investigations 11 to determine the reasonably anticipated future highway 12 needs; or for making of surveys, plans, specifications and estimates for and in the construction and maintenance of 13 14 flight strips and of highways necessary to provide access 15 to military and naval reservations, to defense industries 16 and defense-industry sites, and to the sources of raw materials and for replacing existing highways and highway 17 connections shut off from general public use at military 18 19 and naval reservations and defense-industry sites, or for 20 the purchase of right-of-way, except that the State shall 21 be reimbursed in full for any expense incurred in building 22 the flight strips; or for the operating and maintaining of 23 highway garages; or for patrolling and policing the public 24 highways and conserving the peace; or for the operating 25 expenses of the Department relating to the administration 26 of public transportation programs; or, during fiscal year

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2012 only, for the purposes of a grant not to exceed 1 2 \$8,500,000 to the Regional Transportation Authority on 3 behalf of PACE for the purpose of ADA/Para-transit expenses; or, during fiscal year 2013 only, for 4 the 5 purposes of a grant not to exceed \$3,825,000 to the Regional Transportation Authority on behalf of PACE for the 6 7 purpose of ADA/Para-transit expenses; or, during fiscal 8 year 2014 only, for the purposes of a grant not to exceed 9 \$3,825,000 to the Regional Transportation Authority on 10 behalf of PACE for the purpose of ADA/Para-transit 11 expenses; or, during fiscal year 2015 only, for the 12 purposes of a grant not to exceed \$3,825,000 to the 13 Regional Transportation Authority on behalf of PACE for the 14 purpose of ADA/Para-transit expenses; or for any of those 15 purposes or any other purpose that may be provided by law.

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Appropriations for any of those purposes are payable from the Road Fund. Appropriations may also be made from the Road Fund for the administrative expenses of any State agency that are related to motor vehicles or arise from the use of motor vehicles.

Beginning with fiscal year 1980 and thereafter, no Road Fund monies shall be appropriated to the following Departments or agencies of State government for administration, grants, or operations; but this limitation is not a restriction upon appropriating for those purposes any Road Fund monies that are eligible for federal reimbursement; - 4 - LRB099 10632 JWD 31778 b

1. Department of Public Health;

Department of Transportation, only with respect to subsidies for one-half fare Student Transportation and Reduced Fare for Elderly, except during fiscal year 2012 only when no more than \$40,000,000 may be expended and except during fiscal year 2013 only when no more than \$17,570,300 may be expended and except during fiscal year 2014 only when no more than \$17,570,000 may be expended and except during fiscal year 2015 only when no more than \$17,570,000 may be expended;

Department of Central Management Services, except
 for expenditures incurred for group insurance premiums of
 appropriate personnel;

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4. Judicial Systems and Agencies.

Beginning with fiscal year 1981 and thereafter, no Road Fund monies shall be appropriated to the following Departments or agencies of State government for administration, grants, or operations; but this limitation is not a restriction upon appropriating for those purposes any Road Fund monies that are eligible for federal reimbursement:

Department of State Police, except for expenditures
 with respect to the Division of Operations;

2. Department of Transportation, only with respect to 24 Intercity Rail Subsidies, except during fiscal year 2012 25 only when no more than \$40,000,000 may be expended and 26 except during fiscal year 2013 only when no more than

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\$26,000,000 may be expended and except during fiscal year 2 2014 only when no more than \$38,000,000 may be expended and 3 except during fiscal year 2015 only when no more than \$42,000,000 may be expended, and Rail Freight Services.

5 Beginning with fiscal year 1982 and thereafter, no Road Fund monies shall be appropriated to the following Departments 6 7 or agencies of State government for administration, grants, or operations; but this limitation is not a restriction upon 8 9 appropriating for those purposes any Road Fund monies that are 10 eligible for federal reimbursement: Department of Central 11 Management Services, except for awards made by the Illinois 12 Workers' Compensation Commission under the terms of the 13 Workers' Compensation Act or Workers' Occupational Diseases Act for injury or death of an employee of the Division of 14 15 Highways in the Department of Transportation.

Beginning with fiscal year 1984 and thereafter, no Road Fund monies shall be appropriated to the following Departments or agencies of State government for administration, grants, or operations; but this limitation is not a restriction upon appropriating for those purposes any Road Fund monies that are eligible for federal reimbursement:

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1. Department of State Police, except not more than 40% of the funds appropriated for the Division of Operations;

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2. State Officers.

25 Beginning with fiscal year 1984 and thereafter, no Road 26 Fund monies shall be appropriated to any Department or agency

of State government for administration, grants, or operations 1 2 except as provided hereafter; but this limitation is not a 3 restriction upon appropriating for those purposes any Road Fund monies that are eligible for federal reimbursement. It shall 4 5 not be lawful to circumvent the above appropriation limitations 6 bv governmental reorganization or other methods. 7 Appropriations shall be made from the Road Fund only in 8 accordance with the provisions of this Section.

9 Money in the Road Fund shall, if and when the State of Illinois incurs any bonded indebtedness for the construction of 10 11 permanent highways, be set aside and used for the purpose of 12 paying and discharging during each fiscal year the principal 13 and interest on that bonded indebtedness as it becomes due and 14 payable as provided in the Transportation Bond Act, and for no other purpose. The surplus, if any, in the Road Fund after the 15 16 payment of principal and interest on that bonded indebtedness 17 then annually due shall be used as follows:

18 first -- to pay the cost of administration of Chapters
19 2 through 10 of the Illinois Vehicle Code; and

secondly -- no Road Fund monies derived from fees, 20 license taxes relating to registration, 21 excises, or 22 operation and use of vehicles on public highways or to 23 fuels used for the propulsion of those vehicles, shall be 24 appropriated or expended other than for costs of 25 administering the laws imposing those fees, excises, and 26 license taxes, statutory refunds and adjustments allowed

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thereunder, administrative costs of the Department of 1 2 Transportation, including, but not limited to, the 3 operating expenses of the Department relating to the administration of public transportation programs, payment 4 5 of debts and liabilities incurred in construction and reconstruction of public highways and bridges, acquisition 6 7 rights-of-way for and the cost of construction, of 8 reconstruction, maintenance, repair, and operation of 9 public highways and bridges under the direction and 10 supervision of the State, political subdivision, or 11 municipality collecting those monies, or during fiscal 12 year 2012 only for the purposes of a grant not to exceed 13 \$8,500,000 to the Regional Transportation Authority on 14 behalf of PACE for the purpose of ADA/Para-transit 15 expenses, or during fiscal year 2013 only for the purposes 16 of a grant not to exceed \$3,825,000 to the Regional 17 Transportation Authority on behalf of PACE for the purpose of ADA/Para-transit expenses, or during fiscal year 2014 18 19 only for the purposes of a grant not to exceed \$3,825,000 20 to the Regional Transportation Authority on behalf of PACE 21 for the purpose of ADA/Para-transit expenses, or during 22 fiscal year 2015 only for the purposes of a grant not to 23 exceed \$3,825,000 to the Regional Transportation Authority 24 on behalf of PACE for the purpose of ADA/Para-transit 25 expenses, and the costs for patrolling and policing the 26 public highways (by State, political subdivision, or

1 municipality collecting that money) for enforcement of 2 traffic laws. The separation of grades of such highways 3 with railroads and costs associated with protection of 4 at-grade highway and railroad crossing shall also be 5 permissible.

6 Appropriations for any of such purposes are payable from 7 the Road Fund or the Grade Crossing Protection Fund as provided 8 in Section 8 of the Motor Fuel Tax Law.

9 Except as provided in this paragraph, beginning with fiscal 10 year 1991 and thereafter, no Road Fund monies shall be 11 appropriated to the Department of State Police for the purposes 12 of this Section in excess of its total fiscal year 1990 Road 13 Fund appropriations for those purposes unless otherwise provided in Section 5g of this Act. For fiscal years 2003, 14 15 2004, 2005, 2006, and 2007 only, no Road Fund monies shall be 16 appropriated to the Department of State Police for the purposes 17 of this Section in excess of \$97,310,000. For fiscal year 2008 only, no Road Fund monies shall be appropriated to the 18 Department of State Police for the purposes of this Section in 19 20 excess of \$106,100,000. For fiscal year 2009 only, no Road Fund monies shall be appropriated to the Department of State Police 21 22 for the purposes of this Section in excess of \$114,700,000. 23 Beginning in fiscal year 2010, no road fund moneys shall be appropriated to the Department of State Police. Beginning in 24 25 fiscal year 2016, no road fund moneys shall be appropriated to the Department of State Police, except \$20,000,000 to 26

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administer the requirements of the Illinois Motor Carrier
 Safety Act and Illinois Hazardous Materials Safety Act. It
 shall not be lawful to circumvent this limitation on
 appropriations by governmental reorganization or other methods
 unless otherwise provided in Section 5g of this Act.

In fiscal year 1994, no Road Fund monies shall be appropriated to the Secretary of State for the purposes of this Section in excess of the total fiscal year 1991 Road Fund appropriations to the Secretary of State for those purposes, plus \$9,800,000. It shall not be lawful to circumvent this limitation on appropriations by governmental reorganization or other method.

Beginning with fiscal year 1995 and thereafter, no Road Fund monies shall be appropriated to the Secretary of State for the purposes of this Section in excess of the total fiscal year 16 1994 Road Fund appropriations to the Secretary of State for those purposes. It shall not be lawful to circumvent this limitation on appropriations by governmental reorganization or other methods.

Beginning with fiscal year 2000, total Road Fund appropriations to the Secretary of State for the purposes of this Section shall not exceed the amounts specified for the following fiscal years:

8 For fiscal year 2010, no road fund moneys shall be 9 appropriated to the Secretary of State.

Beginning in fiscal year 2011, moneys in the Road Fund shall be appropriated to the Secretary of State for the exclusive purpose of paying refunds due to overpayment of fees related to Chapter 3 of the Illinois Vehicle Code unless otherwise provided for by law.

15 It shall not be lawful to circumvent this limitation on 16 appropriations by governmental reorganization or other 17 methods.

No new program may be initiated in fiscal year 1991 and thereafter that is not consistent with the limitations imposed by this Section for fiscal year 1984 and thereafter, insofar as appropriation of Road Fund monies is concerned.

Nothing in this Section prohibits transfers from the Road Fund to the State Construction Account Fund under Section 5e of this Act; nor to the General Revenue Fund, as authorized by this amendatory Act of the 93rd General Assembly.

26 The additional amounts authorized for expenditure in this

1 Section by Public Acts 92-0600, 93-0025, 93-0839, and 94-91 2 shall be repaid to the Road Fund from the General Revenue Fund 3 in the next succeeding fiscal year that the General Revenue 4 Fund has a positive budgetary balance, as determined by 5 generally accepted accounting principles applicable to 6 government.

7 The additional amounts authorized for expenditure by the 8 Secretary of State and the Department of State Police in this 9 Section by this amendatory Act of the 94th General Assembly 10 shall be repaid to the Road Fund from the General Revenue Fund in the next succeeding fiscal year that the General Revenue 11 12 Fund has a positive budgetary balance, as determined by generally accepted accounting principles 13 applicable to 14 government.

Section 10. The Illinois Hazardous Materials Transportation Act is amended by changing Sections 2 and 3 as follows:

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(430 ILCS 30/2) (from Ch. 95 1/2, par. 700-2)

Sec. 2. It is the finding of the General Assembly that hazardous materials are essential for various industrial, commercial and other purposes; that their transportation is a necessary incident to their use; and that such transportation is required for the employment and economic prosperity of the
 People of the State of Illinois.

3 It is therefore declared to be the policy of the General 4 Assembly to improve the regulatory and enforcement authority of 5 the Department of <u>State Police</u> <del>Transportation</del> to protect the 6 People of the State of Illinois against the risk to life and 7 property inherent in the transportation of hazardous materials 8 over highways by keeping such risk to a minimum consistent with 9 technical feasibility and economic reasonableness.

10 It is not the intent of the General Assembly to regulate 11 the movement of hazardous materials in such quantities that 12 would not pose a substantial danger to the public health and 13 safety, such as fuels, fertilizer and agricultural chemicals 14 while being used in a normal farming operation or in transit to 15 the farm.

Sec. 3. Unless the context otherwise clearly requires, as used in this Act:

20 "Commerce" means trade, traffic, commerce or 21 transportation within the State;

"Department" means the Illinois Department of <u>State Police</u>
 Transportation;

24 "Discharge" means leakage, seepage, or other release;
25 "Hazardous material" means a substance or material in a

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quantity and form determined by the United States Department of Transportation to be capable of posing an unreasonable risk to health and safety or property when transported in commerce;

4 "Knowingly" means a person has actual knowledge of the 5 facts giving rise to the violation or a reasonable person 6 acting in the circumstances and exercising due care would have 7 such knowledge;

8 "Law Enforcement Officials" means the Illinois State 9 Police or any duly authorized employees of a local governmental 10 agency who are primarily responsible for prevention or 11 detection of crime and enforcement of the criminal code and the 12 highway and traffic laws of this State or any political 13 subdivision of such State;

"Person" means 14 any natural person or individual. firm, 15 governmental body, association, partnership, 16 copartnership, joint venture, company, corporation, joint 17 stock company, trust, estate or any other legal entity or their legal representative, agent or assigns; 18

19 "Transports" or "transportation" means any movement of 20 property over the highway and any loading, unloading or storage 21 incidental to such movement.

23 Section 15. The Illinois Vehicle Code is amended by 24 changing Sections 18b-101, 18b-102, 18b-104, and 18b-109 as 25 follows:

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(625 ILCS 5/18b-101) (from Ch. 95 1/2, par. 18b-101)
 Sec. 18b-101. Definitions. Unless the context otherwise
 clearly requires, as used in this Chapter:

4 "Agricultural commodities" means any agricultural
5 commodity, non-processed food, feed, fiber, or livestock,
6 including insects.

7 "Agricultural operations" means the operation of a motor 8 vehicle or combination of vehicles transporting agricultural 9 commodities or farm supplies for agricultural purposes.

10 "Air mile" means a nautical mile, which is equivalent to 11 6,076 feet or 1,852 meters. Accordingly, 100 air miles are 12 equivalent to 115.08 statute miles or 185.2 kilometers.

"Commercial motor vehicle" means any self propelled or 13 14 towed vehicle used on public highways in interstate and 15 intrastate commerce to transport passengers or property when 16 the vehicle has a gross vehicle weight, a gross vehicle weight rating, a gross combination weight, or a gross combination 17 weight rating of 10,001 or more pounds; or the vehicle is used 18 or designed to transport more than 15 passengers, including the 19 20 driver; or the vehicle is designed to carry 15 or fewer 21 passengers and is operated by a contract carrier transporting 22 employees in the course of their employment on a highway of this State; or the vehicle is used or designed to transport 23 24 between 9 and 15 passengers, including the driver, for direct compensation; or the vehicle is used in the transportation of 25

hazardous materials in a quantity requiring placarding under the Illinois Hazardous Materials Transportation Act. This definition shall not include farm machinery, fertilizer spreaders, and other special agricultural movement equipment described in Section 3-809 nor implements of husbandry as defined in Section 1-130.

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7 "Covered farm vehicle", for purposes of this Chapter and 8 rule-making under this Chapter, means a straight truck or 9 articulated vehicle, excluding vehicles transporting hazardous 10 materials of a type or quantity that requires the vehicle to be 11 placarded in accordance with the Illinois Hazardous Materials 12 Transportation Act, registered in this State or another state 13 and equipped with a special license plate or other designation by the state in which the vehicle is registered identifying the 14 15 vehicle as a covered farm vehicle for law enforcement personnel 16 and:

(1) is operated by a farm or ranch owner or operator,
or an employee or family member of the farm or ranch owner
or operator; and

20 (2) is being used to transport the following to or from21 a farm or ranch:

22	(A) agricultural commodities;
23	(B) livestock; or
24	(C) machinery or supplies; and
25	(3) if registered in this State, is:
26	(A) registered as a farm truck under subsection (c)

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of Section 3-815 of this Code; or

2 (B) operated in combination as an articulated 3 vehicle when the truck in the combination is registered for 12,000 lbs. or less as a covered farm vehicle under 4 5 subsections (a) and (a-5) of Section 3-815 of this Code or subsection (a) of Section 3-818 of this Code and 6 7 contains in the cab of the motor vehicle a registration designating the vehicle as a covered farm vehicle under 8 9 subsections (a) and (a-5) of Section 3-815 of this Code 10 and the trailer in the combination is registered as a 11 farm trailer under subsection (a) of Section 3-819 of 12 this Code and displays a farm registration license plate; or 13

14 (C) a truck registered for 12,000 lbs. or less as a 15 covered farm vehicle under subsections (a) and (a-5) of 16 Section 3-815 of this Code or subsection (a) of Section 17 3-818 of this Code containing in the cab of the motor vehicle a registration designating the vehicle as a 18 19 covered farm vehicle under subsections (a) and (a-5) of 20 Section 3-815 of this Code that is towing an implement 21 of husbandry as part of a farming operation; and

(4) is not used in for-hire motor carrier operations;
however, for-hire motor carrier operations do not include
the operation of a vehicle meeting the definition of a
covered farm vehicle by a tenant pursuant to a crop share
farm lease agreement to transport the landlord's portion of

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1 the crops under that agreement; and

(5) has a gross vehicle weight rating (GVWR), a gross
combination weight rating (GCWR), or a gross vehicle weight
or gross vehicle combination weight, whichever is greater,
that is:

(A) 26,001 lbs. or less, for vehicles operating in interstate commerce; or

8 (B) greater than 26,001 lbs., operating in 9 interstate commerce and registered in this State; or

10 (C) greater than 26,001 lbs. and traveling 11 interstate within 150 air miles of the farm or ranch 12 for which the vehicle is being operated, regardless of 13 whether it is registered in this State; or

14(D) greater than 10,000 lbs. and traveling15intrastate.

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Department" means Department of State Police.

"Direct compensation" means payment made to the motor carrier by the passengers or a person acting on behalf of the passengers for the transportation services provided, and not included in a total package charge or other assessment for highway transportation services.

22 "Farm supplies for agricultural purposes" means products 23 directly related to the growing or harvesting of agricultural 24 commodities and livestock feed at any time of the year.

25 "Livestock" means cattle, sheep, goats, swine, poultry 26 (including egg-producing poultry), fish used for food, and other animals designated by the Secretary of the United States Department of Transportation (at his or her sole discretion) that are part of a foundation herd (including producing dairy cattle) or offspring.

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"Officer" means Illinois State Police Officer.

6 "Person" means any natural person or individual, 7 association, governmental body, firm, partnership, 8 copartnership, joint venture, company, corporation, joint 9 stock company, trust, estate or any other legal entity or their 10 legal representative, agent or assigns.

Sec. 18b-102. Authority of Department. To the extent necessary to administer this Chapter, the Department is authorized to:

16 (a) Adopt by reference all or any portion of the Federal
17 Motor Carrier Safety Regulations of the United States
18 Department of Transportation, as they are now or hereafter
19 amended.

20 (b) Conduct investigations; make reports; issue subpoenas; 21 hearings; require the production of conduct relevant 22 documents, records and property; take depositions; and, in conjunction with the Illinois State Police, conduct directly or 23 24 indirectly research, development, demonstrations and training 25 activities.

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1 (c) Authorize any officer or Department employee to enter 2 upon, inspect and examine at reasonable times and in a 3 reasonable manner, the records and properties of persons to the 4 extent such records and properties relate to the transportation 5 by motor vehicle of persons or property.

6 (d) Conduct a continuing review of all aspects of the 7 transportation of persons and property by motor vehicle in 8 order to determine and recommend appropriate steps to assure 9 safe transportation by motor vehicle in Illinois.

10 (e) Administer and enforce the provisions of this Chapter 11 and any rules and regulations issued under this Chapter. Only 12 the <u>Department</u> <del>Illinois State Police</del> shall be authorized to 13 stop and inspect any commercial motor vehicle or driver at any 14 time for the purpose of determining compliance with the 15 provisions of this Chapter or rules and regulations issued 16 under this Chapter.

The Department shall cooperate with other State agencies regulating transportation by motor vehicles and may enter into interagency agreements for the purpose of sharing data. 1 regulations issued under this Chapter.

(625 ILCS 5/18b-109) (from Ch. 95 1/2, par. 18b-109) 3 Sec. 18b-109. Enforcement of Rules and Regulations. Only 4 5 the <u>Department</u> <del>Illinois State Police</del> shall enforce the rules 6 and regulations issued under this Chapter against drivers and 7 persons other than drivers. The Department and the Illinois State Police shall enforce the rules and regulations issued 8 9 under this Chapter against persons other than drivers. 10 (Source: P.A. 86-611.)

Section 99. Effective date. This Act takes effect July 1, 2015.
