AMENDMENT NO. _____. Amend House Bill 4159, by deleting

everything after the enacting clause and inserting the

following:

"ARTICLE 1

6

Section 5. The sum of \$4,969,000, or so much thereof as

7

may be necessary, is appropriated from the General Revenue

8

Fund to the Office of the Governor for operational expenses

9

of the fiscal year ending June 30, 2016.

10

Section 10. The sum of \$100,000, or so much thereof as

11

may be necessary, is appropriated from the Governor's Grant

12

Fund to the Office of the Governor to be expended in

13

accordance with the terms and conditions upon which such

1 funds were received and in the exercise of the powers or
2 performance of the duties of the Office of the Governor.

3 ARTICLE 2

4 Section 5. The amount of \$1,256,400, or so much thereof
5 as may be necessary, is appropriated from the General Revenue
6 Fund to the Office of the Lieutenant Governor to meet its
7 operational expenses for the fiscal year beginning July 1,
8 2015.

9 Section 10. The sum of \$47,500, or so much thereof as
10 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Agricultural
11 Premium Fund to the Office of the Lieutenant Governor for all
12 costs associated with the Rural Affairs Council including any
13 grants or administrative expenses.

14 ARTICLE 3

15 Section 5. The sum of \$30,843,200, or so much thereof as
16 may be necessary, is appropriated from the General Revenue
17 Fund to the Office of the Attorney General to meet its
18 operational expenses for the fiscal year ending June 30,
19 2016.

1 Section 10. The sum of \$1,400,000, or so much thereof as
2 may be necessary, is appropriated from the General Revenue
3 Fund to the Office of the Attorney General for disbursement
4 to the Illinois Equal Justice Foundation for use as provided
5 in the Illinois Equal Justice Act.

6 Section 15. The sum of \$1,000,000, or so much thereof as
7 is available for use by the Attorney General, is appropriated
8 to the Attorney General from the Illinois Gaming Law
9 Enforcement Fund for State law enforcement purposes.

10 Section 20. The sum of \$11,200,000, or so much thereof
11 as may be necessary, is appropriated from the Attorney
12 General Court Ordered and Voluntary Compliance Payment
13 Projects Fund to the Office of the Attorney General for use,
14 subject to pertinent court order or agreement, in the
15 performance of any function pertaining to the exercise of the
16 duties of the Attorney General, including State law
17 enforcement and public education.

18 Section 25. The sum of \$1,900,000, or so much thereof as
19 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Illinois Charity
20 Bureau Fund to the Office of the Attorney General to enforce
21 the provisions of the Solicitation for Charity Act and to
22 gather and disseminate information about charitable trustees

1 and organizations to the public.

2 Section 30. The sum of \$7,000,000, or so much thereof as
3 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Attorney General
4 Whistleblower Reward and Protection Fund to the Office of the
5 Attorney General for ordinary and contingent expenses,
6 including State law enforcement purposes.

7 Section 35. The sum of \$11,300,000, or so much thereof
8 as may be necessary, is appropriated from the Attorney
9 General's State Projects and Court Ordered Distribution Fund
10 to the Attorney General for payment of interagency
11 agreements, for court-ordered distributions to third parties,
12 and, subject to pertinent court order, for performance of any
13 function pertaining to the exercise of the duties of the
14 Attorney General, including State law enforcement and public
15 education.

16 Section 40. The following named sums, or so much thereof
17 as may be necessary, respectively, for the objects and
18 purposes named in this Section, are appropriated to the
19 Attorney General to meet the ordinary and contingent expenses
20 of the Attorney General:

17 Section 50. The sum of \$1,000,000, or so much thereof as
 18 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Attorney General
 19 Federal Grant Fund to the Office of the Attorney General for
 20 funding for federal grants.

21 Section 55. The sum of \$500,000, or so much thereof as
 22 may be necessary, is appropriated to the Office of the

1 Attorney General from the Domestic Violence Fund pursuant to
2 Public Act 95-711 for grants to public or private nonprofit
3 agencies for the purposes of facilitating or providing free
4 domestic violence legal advocacy, assistance, or services to
5 victims of domestic violence who are married or formerly
6 married or parties or former parties to a civil union related
7 to order of protection proceedings, or other proceedings for
8 civil remedies for domestic violence.

9 Section 60. The sum of \$3,500,000, or so much thereof as
10 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Attorney General
11 Tobacco Fund to the Office of the Attorney General for the
12 oversight, enforcement, and implementation of the Master
13 Settlement Agreement entered in the case of People of the
14 State of Illinois v. Philip Morris, et al (Circuit Court of
15 Cook County, No. 96L13146), for the administration and
16 enforcement of the Tobacco Product Manufacturers' Escrow Act,
17 for the handling of tobacco-related litigation, and for other
18 law enforcement activities of the Attorney General.

19 Section 65. The sum of \$50,000, or so much thereof as may
20 be necessary, is appropriated from the Attorney General Sex
21 Offender Awareness, Training, and Education Fund to the
22 Office of the Attorney General to administer the I-SORT
23 program and to alert and educate the public, victims, and

1 witnesses of their rights under various victim notification
 2 laws and for training law enforcement agencies, State's
 3 Attorneys, and medical providers regarding their legal duties
 4 concerning the prosecution and investigation of sex offenses.

5 ARTICLE 4

12 5 through 30.

13 ARTICLE 8

14 Section 5. The sum of \$13,091,050, or so much thereof as
15 may be necessary, respectively, is appropriated to the
16 President of the Senate and the Speaker of the House of
17 Representatives for furnishing the items provided in Section
18 4 of the General Assembly Compensation Act to members of
19 their respective houses throughout the year in connection
20 with their legislative duties and responsibilities and not in
21 connection with any political campaign as prescribed by law.
22 Of this amount, 37.436% is appropriated to the President of

1 the Senate for such expenditures and 62.564% is appropriated
2 to the Speaker of the House for such expenditures.

3 Section 10. Payments from the sums appropriated in
4 Section 5 hereof shall be made only upon the delivery of a
5 voucher approved by the member to the State Comptroller. The
6 voucher shall also be approved by the President of the Senate
7 or the Speaker of the House of Representatives as the case
8 may be.

9 Section 15. The sum of \$20,603,400, or so much thereof
10 as may be necessary, respectively, is appropriated to meet
11 the ordinary and incidental expenses of the Senate
12 legislative leadership and legislative staff assistants and
13 the House Majority and Minority leadership staff, general
14 staff and office operations. Of this amount, 25.7% is
15 appropriated to the President of the Senate for such
16 expenditures, 25.7% is appropriated to the Senate Minority
17 Leader for such expenditures and 24.8% is appropriated to the
18 Speaker of the House for such expenditures, and 23.8% is
19 appropriated to the House Minority Leader for such
20 expenditures.

21 Section 20. The sum of \$9,882,100, or so much thereof as
22 may be necessary, respectively, is appropriated to the

1 President of the Senate and the Speaker of the House of
2 Representatives for the ordinary and incidental expenses of
3 committees, the general staff and operations, per diem
4 employees, special and standing committees, expenses incurred
5 in transcribing and printing of debates. Of this amount,
6 43.018% is appropriated to the President of the Senate for
7 such expenditures and 56.982% is appropriated to the Speaker
8 of the House for such expenditures.

9 Section 25. The sum of \$309,200, or so much thereof as
10 may be necessary, respectively, is appropriated to the
11 President of the Senate and the Speaker of the House of
12 Representatives for the ordinary and incidental expenses,
13 also including the purchasing on contract as required by law
14 of printing, binding, printing paper, stationery and office
15 supplies. For the House, no part of which shall be expended
16 for expenses of purchasing, handling or distributing such
17 supplies and against which no indebtedness shall be incurred
