The sum of \$8,120,500, or so much thereof as may be necessary, is appropriated from the General Revenue 6 7 Fund to the Supreme Court for probation reimbursements, including reimbursement for Sex Offender GPS tracking. 8 Section 10. This Article shall not be effective if SB 9 2035 of the 99th General Assembly becomes law. 10
