1 AMENDMENT TO HOUSE BILL 5651

2 AMENDMENT NO. _____. Amend House Bill 5651 by replacing
3 everything after the enacting clause with the following:

4 "Section 5. The Illinois Vehicle Code is amended by
5 changing Section 3-414 as follows:

6 (625 ILCS 5/3-414) (from Ch. 95 1/2, par. 3-414)

7 Sec. 3-414. Expiration of registration.

8 (a) Every vehicle registration under this Chapter and every
9 registration card and registration plate or registration
10 sticker issued hereunder to a vehicle shall be for the periods
11 specified in this Chapter and shall expire at midnight on the
12 day and date specified in this Section as follows:

13 1. When registered on a calendar year basis commencing
14 January 1, expiration shall be on the 31st day of December
15 or at such other date as may be selected in the discretion
16 of the Secretary of State; however, through December 31,

1 2004, registrations of apportionable vehicles,
2 motorcycles, motor driven cycles and pedalcycles shall
3 commence on the first day of April and shall expire March
4 31st of the following calendar year;

5 1.1. Beginning January 1, 2005, registrations of
6 motorcycles and motor driven cycles shall commence on
7 January 1 and shall expire on December 31 or on another
8 date that may be selected by the Secretary; registrations
9 of apportionable vehicles and pedalcycles, however, shall
10 commence on the first day of April and shall expire March
11 31 of the following calendar year;

12 2. When registered on a 2 calendar year basis
13 commencing January 1 of an even-numbered year, expiration
14 shall be on the 31st day of December of the ensuing
15 odd-numbered year, or at such other later date as may be
16 selected in the discretion of the Secretary of State not
17 beyond March 1 next;

18 3. When registered on a fiscal year basis commencing
19 July 1, expiration shall be on the 30th day of June or at
20 such other later date as may be selected in the discretion
21 of the Secretary of State not beyond September 1 next;

22 4. When registered on a 2 fiscal year basis commencing
23 July 1 of an even-numbered year, expiration shall be on the
24 30th day of June of the ensuing even-numbered year, or at
25 such other later date as may be selected in the discretion
26 of the Secretary of State not beyond September 1 next;

1 5. When registered on a 4 fiscal year basis commencing
2 July 1 of an even-numbered year, expiration shall be on the
3 30th day of June of the second ensuing even-numbered year,
4 or at such other later date as may be selected in the
5 discretion of the Secretary of State not beyond September 1
6 next;

7 (a-5) The Secretary may, in his or her discretion, require
8 an owner of a motor vehicle of the first division or a motor
9 vehicle of the second division weighing not more than 8,000
10 pounds to select the owner's birthday as the date of
11 registration expiration under this Section. If the motor
12 vehicle has more than one registered owner, the owners may
13 select one registered owner's birthday as the date of
14 registration expiration. The Secretary may adopt any rules
15 necessary to implement this subsection.

16 (b) Vehicle registrations of vehicles of the first division
17 shall be for a calendar year, 2 calendar year, 3 calendar year,
18 or 5 calendar year basis as provided for in this Chapter.

19 Vehicle registrations of vehicles under Sections 3-807,
20 3-808 and 3-809 shall be on an indefinite term basis or a 2
21 calendar year basis as provided for in this Chapter.

22 Vehicle registrations for vehicles of the second division
23 shall be for a fiscal year, 2 fiscal year or calendar year
24 basis as provided for in this Chapter.

25 Motor vehicles registered under the provisions of Section
26 3-402.1 shall be issued multi-year registration plates with a

1 new registration card issued annually upon payment of the
2 appropriate fees. Motor vehicles registered under the
3 provisions of Section 3-405.3 shall be issued multi-year
4 registration plates with a new multi-year registration card
5 issued pursuant to subsections (j), (k), and (l) of this
6 Section upon payment of the appropriate fees. Apportionable
7 trailers and apportionable semitrailers registered under the
8 provisions of Section 3-402.1 shall be issued multi-year
9 registration plates and cards that will be subject to
10 revocation for failure to pay annual fees required by Section
11 3-814.1. The Secretary shall determine when these vehicles
12 shall be issued new registration plates.

13 (c) Every vehicle registration specified in Section 3-810
14 and every registration card and registration plate or
15 registration sticker issued thereunder shall expire on the 31st
16 day of December of each year or at such other date as may be
17 selected in the discretion of the Secretary of State.

18 (d) Every vehicle registration for a vehicle of the second
19 division weighing over 8,000 pounds, except as provided in
20 paragraph (g) of this Section, and every registration card and
21 registration plate or registration sticker, where applicable,
22 issued hereunder to such vehicles shall be issued for a fiscal
23 year commencing on July 1st of each registration year. However,
24 the Secretary of State may, pursuant to an agreement or
25 arrangement or declaration providing for apportionment of a
26 fleet of vehicles with other jurisdictions, provide for

1 registration of such vehicles under apportionment or for all of
2 the vehicles registered in Illinois by an applicant who
3 registers some of his vehicles under apportionment on a
4 calendar year basis instead, and the fees or taxes to be paid
5 on a calendar year basis shall be identical to those specified
6 in this Act for a fiscal year registration. Provision for
7 installment payment may also be made.

8 (e) Semitrailer registrations under apportionment may be
9 on a calendar year under a reciprocal agreement or arrangement
10 and all other semitrailer registrations shall be on fiscal year
11 or 2 fiscal year or 4 fiscal year basis as provided for in this
12 Chapter.

13 (f) The Secretary of State may convert annual registration
14 plates or 2-year registration plates, whether registered on a
15 calendar year or fiscal year basis, to multi-year plates. The
16 determination of which plate categories and when to convert to
17 multi-year plates is solely within the discretion of the
18 Secretary of State.

19 (g) After January 1, 1975, each registration, registration
20 card and registration plate or registration sticker, where
21 applicable, issued for a recreational vehicle or recreational
22 or camping trailer, except a house trailer, used exclusively by
23 the owner for recreational purposes, and not used commercially
24 nor as a truck or bus, nor for hire, shall be on a calendar year
25 basis; except that the Secretary of State shall provide for
26 registration and the issuance of registration cards and plates

1 or registration stickers, where applicable, for one 6-month
2 period in order to accomplish an orderly transition from a
3 fiscal year to a calendar year basis. Fees and taxes due under
4 this Act for a registration year shall be appropriately reduced
5 for such 6-month transitional registration period.

6 (h) The Secretary of State may, in order to accomplish an
7 orderly transition for vehicles registered under Section
8 3-402.1 of this Code from a calendar year registration to a
9 March 31st expiration, require applicants to pay fees and taxes
10 due under this Code on a 15 month registration basis. However,
11 if in the discretion of the Secretary of State this creates an
12 undue hardship on any applicant the Secretary may allow the
13 applicant to pay 3 month fees and taxes at the time of
14 registration and the additional 12 month fees and taxes to be
15 payable no later than March 31 of the year after this
16 amendatory Act of 1991 takes effect.

17 (i) The Secretary of State may stagger registrations, or
18 change the annual expiration date, as necessary for the
19 convenience of the public and the efficiency of his Office. In
20 order to appropriately and effectively accomplish any such
21 staggering, the Secretary of State is authorized to prorate all
22 required registration fees, rounded to the nearest dollar, but
23 in no event for a period longer than 18 months, at a monthly
24 rate for a 12 month registration fee.

25 (j) The Secretary of State may enter into an agreement with
26 a rental owner, as defined in Section 3-400 of this Code, who

1 registers a fleet of motor vehicles of the first division
2 pursuant to Section 3-405.3 of this Code to provide for the
3 registration of the rental owner's vehicles on a 2 or 3
4 calendar year basis and the issuance of multi-year registration
5 plates with a new registration card issued up to every 3 years.

6 (k) The Secretary of State may provide multi-year
7 registration cards for any registered fleet of motor vehicles
8 of the first or second division that are registered pursuant to
9 Section 3-405.3 of this Code. Each motor vehicle of the
10 registered fleet must carry a unique multi-year registration
11 card that displays the vehicle identification number of the
12 registered motor vehicle. The Secretary of State shall
13 promulgate rules in order to implement multi-year
14 registrations.

15 (l) Beginning with the 2018 registration year, the
16 Secretary of State may enter into an agreement with a rental
17 owner, as defined in Section 3-400 of this Code, who registers
18 a fleet of motor vehicles of the first division under Section
19 3-405.3 of this Code to provide for the registration of the
20 rental owner's vehicle on a 5 calendar year basis. Motor
21 vehicles registered on a 5 calendar year basis shall be issued
22 a distinct registration plate that expires on a 5-year cycle.
23 The Secretary may prorate the registration of these
24 registration plates to the length of time remaining in the
25 5-year cycle. The Secretary may adopt any rules necessary to
26 implement this subsection.
