1 AN ACT concerning finance.

## 2 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, 3 represented in the General Assembly:

Section 5. The Local Food, Farms, and Jobs Act is amended
by changing Sections 20 and 25 as follows:

6 (30 ILCS 595/20)

7 Sec. 20. Responsibilities of the Local Food, Farms, and 8 Jobs Council. The responsibilities of the Local Food, Farms, 9 and Jobs Council include, but are not limited to, the 10 following:

(a) To assist State agencies, State-owned facilities, and other entities with the purchase of local farm or food products and with tracking and reporting of such purchases in order to meet the goals established in Section 10 of this Act.

(b) To assist local farm and food entrepreneurs to identify 15 16 and secure necessary resources and equipment to begin, 17 maintain, and expand projects and networks necessary for the development of local farm or food products; provided, however, 18 that it is the intent of this Act that the Local Food, Farms, 19 20 and Jobs Council will facilitate program start-ups and then 21 relinguish rights, benefits, and control within a reasonably short duration of time. 22

(c) To facilitate the building of infrastructure,

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including aggregation, processing, storage, packaging, and distribution facilities necessary to move local farm or food products to local and other markets.

4 (d) To support and expand programs that recruit, train, and
5 provide technical assistance to Illinois farmers and residents
6 in order to encourage the production of local farm or food
7 products.

8 (e) To coordinate interagency policies, initiatives, and 9 procedures promoting local farm and food products in Illinois 10 communities, by working with and involving State, federal, and 11 local agencies, as well as community based organizations, 12 educational institutions, and trade organizations in executing 13 the purposes of this Act.

To facilitate the elimination of legal barriers 14 (f) 15 hindering the development of a local farm and food economy by 16 working with federal, State, and local public health agencies, 17 other agencies and applicable entities, and the Illinois Attorney General to create consistent and 18 compatible regulations for the production, storage, distribution, and 19 20 marketing of local farm or food products.

(g) To facilitate the use of public lands for growing local farm or food products by working with governmental entities at the local, State, and federal levels.

(h) To set annual goals for all purchases of local farm or
 food products by Illinois residents and to monitor the
 development and expansion of a local farm and food economy

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1 through data collection, tracking, measurement, analysis, and 2 reporting on progress made in an annual report to the Illinois 3 General Assembly.

(i) <u>(Blank).</u> To develop, in collaboration with the
Department of Agriculture, a label and certification program
different than the "Illinois Product" label program, whereby a
label with a specific name and unique design or logo may be
placed on local farm and food products.

9 (j) To initiate and facilitate public awareness campaigns
10 about the economic benefits of a local farm and food economy.

Sec. 25. Governance of the Local Food, Farms, and Jobs Council.

(a) The Local Food, Farms, and Jobs Council shall be
governed by a <u>20-member</u> <del>35 member</del> board of directors, which
shall be comprised of the following:

18 (1) one representative each from the Department of Agriculture; the Department of Commerce and Economic 19 20 Opportunity; the Department of Public Health; the Illinois 21 Finance Authority; the Office of the State Treasurer; an 22 agency tasked with responsibilities over economic or workforce development; the Department of Human Services, 23 24 Office of Health and Prevention; the Department of Human 25 Services, Office of Security and Emergency Preparedness;

1	(2) the Director of the Lieutenant Governor's Rural
2	Affairs Council;
3	<u>(2)</u> <del>(3)</del> one agricultural specialist from the
4	University of Illinois Extension;
5	(3) one representative of the State's largest general
6	farm organization;
7	(4) thirteen representatives, each of whom shall
8	represent at least one of the following interests, and each
9	interest shall be represented by at least one
10	representative:
11	(A) local farm or food product farmers
12	representing different sectors, including, but not
13	limited to, dairy, meat, vegetable, and grain;
14	(B) local farm or food product producers
15	representing different flower, fruit, viticulture,
16	aquaculture, forestry, seeds, fiber, ornamental, or
17	other specialty crop sectors;
18	(C) local farm or food product processors or
19	distributors, preferentially those operating
20	cooperatively or under local ownership;
21	(D) not-for-profit educational organizations that
22	specialize in supporting and expanding local farm or
23	food product networks;
24	(E) local farm or food product retailers;
25	(F) municipalities in the State actively engaged
26	in the development of local farm or food products;

1	(G) banking, investment, or philanthropic
2	communities with expertise in financing or supporting
3	local foods production and infrastructure;
4	(H) community-based organizations focusing on
5	access to local farm or food products;
6	(I) restaurants or food service businesses,
7	schools, or institutions that use or seek to increase
8	and promote use of local foods; and
9	(J) employees working for businesses in the food
10	system.
11	(4) four local farm or food product farmers
12	representing different agribusiness sectors,
13	including, but not limited to, the dairy, meat,
14	vegetable, and grain sectors;
15	(5) four local farm or food product producers
16	representing different flower, fruit, viticulture,
17	aquaculture, forestry, seeds, fiber, vegetable,
18	ornamental, or other specialty crop sectors;
19	(6) two local farm or food product processors;
20	(7) two local farm or food product distributors;
21	(8) three representatives of not-for-profit
22	educational organizations that specialize in supporting
23	and expanding local farm or food product networks;
24	(9) one certifier of specialty local farm or food
25	products, such as an organic, naturally grown, biodynamic,
26	Halal, or Kosher certifier;

(10) one local farm or food product consumer 1 2 representative; (11) two representatives of farm organizations; 3 (12) one representative from a philanthropic 4 5 organization supporting the development of local farm 6 food products; 7 (13) one local farm or food product retailer; 8 -two municipal representatives from different (14)9 communities in the State actively engaged in the 10 development of local farm or food products; 11 (15) four representatives from community-based 12 organizations focusing on access to local farm or food 13 products, including at least 3 minority members; and (16) one chef specializing in the preparation of 14 15 locally grown foods.

(b) The <u>15</u> <del>29</del> non-state governmental board members shall be
appointed by the Governor to 3-year staggered terms as
determined by the Governor. Persons may be nominated by
organizations representing the sectors outlined in subsection
(a) of this Section. Vacancies shall be filled by the Governor.

(c) The Local Food, Farms, and Jobs Council may apply for
and establish a not for profit corporation under the General
Not For Profit Corporation Act of 1986.

(d) The board of directors shall have all the rights,
titles, powers, privileges, and obligations provided for in the
General Not For Profit Corporation Act of 1986. It shall elect

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1 its presiding officers from among its members and may elect or 2 appoint an executive committee, other committees, and 3 subcommittees to conduct the business of the organization.

(e) The Local Food, Farms, and Jobs Council may solicit
grants, loans, and contributions from public or private sources
and may enter into any contracts, grants, loans, or agreements
with respect to the use of such funds to execute the purposes
of this Act. No debt or obligation of the Local Food, Farms,
and Jobs Council shall become the debt or obligation of the
State.

11 (f) The Local Food, Farms, and Jobs Council shall not be 12 considered a State Agency, and its funds shall be considered private funds and held in an appropriate account outside of the 13 14 State Treasury. Private funds collected by the Local Food, 15 Farms, and Jobs Council are not subject to the Public Funds 16 Investment Act. Local Food, Farms, and Jobs Council procurement 17 is exempt from the Illinois Procurement Code. The treasurer of Local Food, Farms, and Jobs Council funds shall be custodian of 18 19 all Local Food, Farms, and Jobs Council funds. The Local Food, 20 Farms, and Jobs Council and its officers shall be responsible for the approval of recording of receipts, approval of 21 22 payments, and the proper filing of required reports. The Local 23 Food, Farms, and Jobs Council's records shall be audited annually by an independent auditor who is a certified public 24 25 accountant and has been selected by the Board. An annual report 26 shall also be compiled by the Board. Both the annual report and

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1 the annual audit shall be filed with any public agency 2 providing funds to the Local Food, Farms, and Jobs Council and 3 be made available to the public.

(g) Subject to the availability of public or private funds,
the board of directors may employ an executive director,
treasurer, other staff, or independent contractors necessary
to execute the purposes of this Act, and it may fix the
compensation, benefits, terms, and conditions of those
persons' employment.

(h) The State Governmental agencies represented on the board of directors may re-direct existing staff, as appropriations permit; assist in executing the purposes of this Act; and provide office space, meeting space, and other research and communication services as appropriate.

(i) The Local Food, Farms, and Jobs Council may be assisted in carrying out its functions by personnel of the Department of Agriculture. The Department shall provide reasonable assistance to the Local Food, Farms, and Jobs Council to help it achieve its purposes.
