1 AN ACT concerning public aid.

## Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, represented in the General Assembly:

- Section 5. The State Finance Act is amended by adding
- 5 Section 5.875 as follows:
- 6 (30 ILCS 105/5.875 new)
- Sec. 5.875. The Healthy Local Food Incentives Fund.
- 8 Section 10. The Illinois Public Aid Code is amended by 9 adding Section 12-4.50 as follows:
- 10 (305 ILCS 5/12-4.50 new)
- 11 Sec. 12-4.50. Healthy Local Food Incentives Program.
- 12 (a) Legislative findings. Diet and other lifestyle choices contribute to more than half of all deaths in Illinois. Health 13 risk factors include smoking, obesity, stress, nutrition, high 14 blood pressure, and alcohol and drug use. Illinois residents 15 16 should be encouraged to adopt diets and lifestyles that lead to wellness. The State can help provide that encouragement by 17 18 funding wellness programs that enhance the health of Illinois 19 residents. Healthy local food incentives encourage wellness 20 among some of the most vulnerable residents of Illinois (those whose incomes are below the poverty line and who often have 2.1

- limited access to fresh, healthy, and affordable foods) by 1 2 doubling the purchasing power of LINK cardholders at farmers 3 markets across the State. The benefits of such a program 4 include: an increase in population health, Medicaid health care 5 cost savings, decreased incidence of preventable diseases,
- increased revenue for Illinois small farmers, and economic 6
- 7 stimulus for the region.
  - (b) Definitions. As used in this Section:
- 9 "FINI eligible fruits and vegetables" means any variety of fresh, canned, dried, or frozen whole or cut fruits and 10 11 vegetables without added sugars, fats, or oils, and salt (i.e.
- 12 sodium), as defined by the Food Insecurity Nutrition Incentive
- Grant Program administered by the United States Department of 13
- 14 Agriculture.

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- "LINK card" means an electronic benefits transfer card 15
- 16 issued by the Department of Human Services for the purpose of
- enabling a user of the card to obtain SNAP benefits or cash. 17
- "SNAP" means the federal Supplemental Nutrition Assistance 18
- 19 Program.
- 20 (c) The Department of Human Services shall establish a
- 21 Healthy Local Food Incentives Program to double the purchasing
- 22 power of Illinois residents with limited access to fresh fruits
- 23 and vegetables. The Healthy Local Food Incentives Fund is
- 24 created as a special fund in the State treasury for the purpose
- 25 of implementing the Healthy Local Food Incentives Program. All
- moneys received pursuant to this Section shall be deposited 26

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into the Healthy Local Food Incentives Fund.

2	(d) Subject to appropriation, the Department of Human
3	Services shall make an annual grant of \$1,000,000 from the Fund
4	to a qualified Illinois non-profit organization or agency,
5	which shall be distributed to participating Illinois farmers
6	markets for the purpose of providing matching dollar incentives
7	(up to a specified amount) for the dollar value of SNAP
8	benefits spent on FINI eligible fruits and vegetables at
9	participating Illinois farmers markets and direct
10	producer-to-consumer venues.
11	(e) The designated qualified non-profit organization or
12	agency shall have a demonstrated track record of:

- agency shall have a demonstrated track record of:
  - (1) building a statewide network;
- (2) designing and implementing successful healthy food 14 incentive programs that connect SNAP recipients with local 15 16 producers;
- 17 (3) implementing funds distribution and reporting 18 processes;
  - (4) providing training and technical assistance to farmers markets;
- 21 (5) conducting community outreach and data collection; 22 and
- 23 (6) providing full accounting and administration of 24 funds distributed to farmers markets.
- 25 (f) At least 60% of the moneys deposited into the Fund 26 shall be distributed to participating Illinois farmers markets

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1	for healthy local food incentives. A maximum of 40% of the
2	moneys deposited into the Fund shall be used for State and
3	local level program development, promotion and outreach,
4	farmers market training and capacity building, technical
5	assistance, program data collection, evaluation,
6	administration, reporting, and local program implementation.
7	(g) Within 90 days after the end of a grant cycle, the
8	designated qualified non-profit organization or agency shall
9	submit a progress report to the Department of Human Services.
10	The progress report shall include the following information:
11	(1) the names and locations of Illinois farmers markets
12	and direct producer-to-consumer venues that received funds
13	distributed under the Program;
14	(2) the dollar amount of funds awarded to each
15	participating Illinois farmers market and direct
16	<pre>producer-to-consumer venue;</pre>
17	(3) the dollar amount of SNAP benefits, and funds
18	provided under the Program, that were spent at Illinois
19	farmers markets participating in the Program, as well as
20	the dollar amount of any unspent funds available under the
21	<pre>Program;</pre>
22	(4) the number of SNAP transactions carried out
23	annually at participating Illinois farmers markets;

(5) the impact of the Program on increasing the

quantity of fresh fruits and vegetables consumed by SNAP

families, as determined by customer surveys.

- (h) No later than December 31, 2016, the Department of 1
- 2 Human Services shall adopt rules to implement the provisions of
- 3 this Section.
- Section 99. Effective date. This Act takes effect upon 4
- 5 becoming law.
