SYNOPSIS AS INTRODUCED:

720 ILCS 5/26-2

from Ch. 38, par. 26-2

Amends the Criminal Code of 2012. Provides that a person also commits interference with emergency communication when he or she knowingly prevents or attempts to prevent a person who reasonably believes an emergency is taking place from contacting a 9-1-1 emergency telephone system, obtaining medical assistance, or making a report to a law enforcement official. Provides that a violation is a Class A misdemeanor.

AN ACT concerning criminal law.

2 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, 3 represented in the General Assembly:

Section 5. The Criminal Code of 2012 is amended by changing
Section 26-2 as follows:

Sec. 26-2. Interference with emergency communication.

8 A person commits interference with emergency (a) 9 communication when he or she knowingly, intentionally and without lawful justification interrupts, disrupts, impedes, or 10 otherwise interferes with the transmission of a communication 11 over a citizens band radio channel, the purpose of which 12 13 communication is to inform or inquire about an emergency.

14 <u>(a-5) A person commits interference with emergency</u> 15 <u>communication when he or she knowingly prevents or attempts to</u> 16 <u>prevent a person who reasonably believes an emergency is taking</u> 17 <u>place from contacting a 9-1-1 emergency telephone system,</u> 18 <u>obtaining medical assistance, or making a report to a law</u> 19 enforcement official.

20 (b) For the purpose of this Section, "emergency" means a 21 condition or circumstance in which an individual is or is 22 reasonably believed by the person transmitting the 23 communication to be in imminent danger of serious bodily injury or in which property is or is reasonably believed by the person transmitting the communication to be in imminent danger of damage or destruction.

(c) Sentence.

5 (1) Interference with emergency communication <u>under</u> 6 <u>subsection (a) of this Section</u> is a Class B misdemeanor, 7 except as otherwise provided in paragraph (2) <u>or (3) of</u> 8 this subsection (c).

9 (2) Interference with emergency communication <u>under</u> 10 <u>subsection (a) of this Section</u>, where serious bodily injury 11 or property loss in excess of \$1,000 results, is a Class A 12 misdemeanor.

13 (3) Interference with emergency communication under
 14 subsection (a-5) of this Section is a Class A misdemeanor.
