SYNOPSIS AS INTRODUCED:

105 ILCS 5/2-3.163

Amends the School Code. Provides that children and adolescents who are registered in the Prioritization of Urgency of Need for Services database before their 17th birthday shall be placed higher on the waiting list than adolescents who are registered on or after their 17th birthday within the same level of priority. Requires the State Board of Education and the Department of Human Services to issue an annual report detailing the number of students who have enrolled in the database broken down by age and grade level. Requires the report to be made available online.

AN ACT concerning education.

2 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, 3 represented in the General Assembly:

Section 5. The School Code is amended by changing Section
2-3.163 as follows:

6 (105 ILCS 5/2-3.163)

Sec. 2-3.163. Prioritization of Urgency of Need for
8 Services database.

9 (a) The General Assembly makes all of the following 10 findings:

(1) The Department of Human Services maintains a statewide database known as the Prioritization of Urgency of Need for Services that records information about individuals with developmental disabilities who are potentially in need of services.

16 (2) The Department of Human Services uses the data on
17 Prioritization of Urgency of Need for Services to select
18 individuals for services as funding becomes available, to
19 develop proposals and materials for budgeting, and to plan
20 for future needs.

(3) Prioritization of Urgency of Need for Services is
available for children and adults with a developmental
disability who have an unmet service need anticipated in

1 the next 5 years.

(4) Prioritization of Urgency of Need for Services is
the first step toward getting developmental disabilities
services in this State. If individuals are not on the
Prioritization of Urgency of Need for Services waiting
list, they are not in queue for State developmental
disabilities services.

8 (5) Prioritization of Urgency of Need for Services may 9 be underutilized by children and their parents or guardians 10 due to lack of awareness or lack of information.

11 (b) The State Board of Education may work with school 12 districts to inform all students with developmental 13 disabilities and their parents or quardians about the Prioritization of Urgency of Need for Services database. 14 15 Children and adolescents who are registered in the 16 Prioritization of Urgency of Need for Services database before 17 their 17th birthday shall be placed higher on the waiting list than adolescents who are registered on or after their 17th 18 19 birthday within the same level of priority.

(c) Subject to appropriation, the Department of Human Services and State Board of Education shall develop and implement an online, computer-based training program for at least one designated employee in every public school in this State to educate him or her about the Prioritization of Urgency of Need for Services database and steps to be taken to ensure children and adolescents are enrolled. The training shall

1 include instruction for at least one designated employee in 2 in every public school contacting the appropriate developmental disabilities Independent Service Coordination 3 agency to enroll children and adolescents in the database. At 4 5 least one designated employee in every public school shall 6 ensure the opportunity to enroll in the Prioritization of 7 Urgency of Need for Services database is discussed during annual individualized education program (IEP) meetings for all 8 9 children and adolescents believed to have a developmental 10 disability.

(d) The State Board of Education, in consultation with the Department of Human Services, shall inform parents and guardians of students through school districts about the Prioritization of Urgency of Need for Services waiting list.

(e) Beginning January 1, 2017 and annually thereafter, the 15 16 State Board of Education and the Department of Human Services 17 shall issue a report detailing the number of students who have enrolled in the Prioritization of Urgency of Need for Services 18 19 database under this Section, broken down by at least age and grade level. Where possible, the report shall also include how 20 21 the student and his or her parent or guardian learned of the 22 database. The report shall be made available online.
