SYNOPSIS AS INTRODUCED:

625 ILCS 5/11-907 from Ch. 95 1/2, par. 11-907

Amends the Illinois Vehicle Code. Allows the use of red, blue, and white oscillating lights on tow trucks.

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AN ACT concerning transportation.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, represented in the General Assembly:

Section 5. The Illinois Vehicle Code is amended by changing
Section 11-907 as follows:

6 (625 ILCS 5/11-907) (from Ch. 95 1/2, par. 11-907)

Sec. 11-907. Operation of vehicles and streetcars on
approach of authorized emergency vehicles.

9 (a) Upon the immediate approach of an authorized emergency 10 vehicle making use of audible and visual signals meeting the 11 requirements of this Code or a police vehicle properly and 12 lawfully making use of an audible or visual signal,

13 (1) the driver of every other vehicle shall yield the 14 right-of-way and shall immediately drive to a position parallel to, and as close as possible to, the right-hand 15 16 edge or curb of the highway clear of any intersection and 17 shall, if necessary to permit the safe passage of the emergency vehicle, stop and remain in such position until 18 19 authorized emergency vehicle has passed, unless the otherwise directed by a police officer and 20

(2) the operator of every streetcar shall immediately
 stop such car clear of any intersection and keep it in such
 position until the authorized emergency vehicle has

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passed, unless otherwise directed by a police officer.

2 (b) This Section shall not operate to relieve the driver of 3 an authorized emergency vehicle from the duty to drive with due 4 regard for the safety of all persons using the highway.

5 (c) Upon approaching a stationary authorized emergency 6 vehicle, when the authorized emergency vehicle is giving a 7 signal by displaying alternately flashing red, red and white, 8 blue, or red and blue<u>, or red, blue, and white</u> lights or amber 9 or yellow warning lights, a person who drives an approaching 10 vehicle shall:

11 (1)proceeding with due caution, vield the 12 right-of-way by making a lane change into a lane not adjacent to that of the authorized emergency vehicle, if 13 14 possible with due regard to safety and traffic conditions, 15 if on a highway having at least 4 lanes with not less than 16 2 lanes proceeding in the same direction as the approaching 17 vehicle; or

(2) proceeding with due caution, reduce the speed of
the vehicle, maintaining a safe speed for road conditions,
if changing lanes would be impossible or unsafe.

As used in this subsection (c), "authorized emergency vehicle" includes any vehicle authorized by law to be equipped with oscillating, rotating, or flashing lights under Section 12-215 of this Code, while the owner or operator of the vehicle is engaged in his or her official duties.

26 (d) A person who violates subsection (c) of this Section

commits a business offense punishable by a fine of not less 1 2 than \$100 or more than \$10,000. It is a factor in aggravation if the person committed the offense while in violation of 3 Section 11-501 of this Code. Imposition of the penalties 4 5 authorized by this subsection (d) for a violation of subsection (c) of this Section that results in the death of another person 6 7 does not preclude imposition of appropriate additional civil or 8 criminal penalties.

9 (e) If a violation of subsection (c) of this Section 10 results in damage to the property of another person, in 11 addition to any other penalty imposed, the person's driving 12 privileges shall be suspended for a fixed period of not less 13 than 90 days and not more than one year.

(f) If a violation of subsection (c) of this Section results in injury to another person, in addition to any other penalty imposed, the person's driving privileges shall be suspended for a fixed period of not less than 180 days and not more than 2 years.

(g) If a violation of subsection (c) of this Section results in the death of another person, in addition to any other penalty imposed, the person's driving privileges shall be suspended for 2 years.

(h) The Secretary of State shall, upon receiving a record
of a judgment entered against a person under subsection (c) of
this Section:

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(1) suspend the person's driving privileges for the

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- 1 mandatory period; or
- 2 (2) extend the period of an existing suspension by the3 appropriate mandatory period.
