SYNOPSIS AS INTRODUCED:

Makes various appropriations to the Office of the Attorney General for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2017. Effective July 1, 2016.

A BILL FOR

1 AN ACT making appropriations.

2 **Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, represented**
3 **in the General Assembly:**

4 Section 5. The sum of \$30,843,200, or so much thereof as
5 may be necessary, is appropriated from the General Revenue
6 Fund to the Office of the Attorney General to meet its
7 operational expenses for the fiscal year ending June 30,
8 2016.

9 Section 10. The sum of \$1,400,000, or so much thereof as
10 may be necessary, is appropriated from the General Revenue
11 Fund to the Office of the Attorney General for disbursement
12 to the Illinois Equal Justice Foundation for use as provided
13 in the Illinois Equal Justice Act.

14 Section 15. The sum of \$1,000,000, or so much thereof as
15 is available for use by the Attorney General, is appropriated
16 to the Attorney General from the Illinois Gaming Law
17 Enforcement Fund for State law enforcement purposes.

18 Section 20. The sum of \$11,200,000, or so much thereof
19 as may be necessary, is appropriated from the Attorney
20 General Court Ordered and Voluntary Compliance Payment

1 Projects Fund to the Office of the Attorney General for use,
2 subject to pertinent court order or agreement, in the
3 performance of any function pertaining to the exercise of the
4 duties of the Attorney General, including State law
5 enforcement and public education.

6 Section 25. The sum of \$1,900,000, or so much thereof as
7 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Illinois Charity
8 Bureau Fund to the Office of the Attorney General to enforce
9 the provisions of the Solicitation for Charity Act and to
10 gather and disseminate information about charitable trustees
11 and organizations to the public.

12 Section 30. The sum of \$7,000,000, or so much thereof as
13 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Attorney General
14 Whistleblower Reward and Protection Fund to the Office of the
15 Attorney General for ordinary and contingent expenses,
16 including State law enforcement purposes.

17 Section 35. The sum of \$11,300,000, or so much thereof
18 as may be necessary, is appropriated from the Attorney
19 General's State Projects and Court Ordered Distribution Fund
20 to the Attorney General for payment of interagency
21 agreements, for court-ordered distributions to third parties,
22 and, subject to pertinent court order, for performance of any

1 function pertaining to the exercise of the duties of the
2 Attorney General, including State law enforcement and public
3 education.

4 Section 40. The following named sums, or so much thereof
5 as may be necessary, respectively, for the objects and
6 purposes named in this Section, are appropriated to the
7 Attorney General to meet the ordinary and contingent expenses
8 of the Attorney General:

23 Section 45. The sum of \$240,000, or so much thereof as

1 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Child Support
2 Administrative Fund to the Office of the Attorney General for
3 child support enforcement purposes.

4 Section 50. The sum of \$1,000,000, or so much thereof as
5 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Attorney General
6 Federal Grant Fund to the Office of the Attorney General for
7 funding for federal grants.

8 Section 55. The sum of \$500,000, or so much thereof as
9 may be necessary, is appropriated to the Office of the
10 Attorney General from the Domestic Violence Fund pursuant to
11 Public Act 95-711 for grants to public or private nonprofit
12 agencies for the purposes of facilitating or providing free
13 domestic violence legal advocacy, assistance, or services to
14 victims of domestic violence who are married or formerly
15 married or parties or former parties to a civil union related
16 to order of protection proceedings, or other proceedings for
17 civil remedies for domestic violence.

18 Section 60. The sum of \$3,500,000, or so much thereof as
19 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Attorney General
20 Tobacco Fund to the Office of the Attorney General for the
21 oversight, enforcement, and implementation of the Master
22 Settlement Agreement entered in the case of People of the

1 State of Illinois v. Philip Morris, et al (Circuit Court of
2 Cook County, No. 96L13146), for the administration and
3 enforcement of the Tobacco Product Manufacturers' Escrow Act,
4 for the handling of tobacco-related litigation, and for other
5 law enforcement activities of the Attorney General.

6 Section 65. The sum of \$50,000, or so much thereof as may
7 be necessary, is appropriated from the Attorney General Sex
8 Offender Awareness, Training, and Education Fund to the
9 Office of the Attorney General to administer the I-SORT
10 program and to alert and educate the public, victims, and
11 witnesses of their rights under various victim notification
12 laws and for training law enforcement agencies, State's
13 Attorneys, and medical providers regarding their legal duties
14 concerning the prosecution and investigation of sex offenses.

15
16 Section 70. The sum of \$1,400,000, or so much thereof as
17 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Access to Justice
18 Fund to the Office of the Attorney General for disbursement
19 to the Illinois Equal Justice Foundation pursuant to the
20 Access to Justice Act.

21 Section 99. Effective date. This Act takes effect July 1,
22 2016.
