## HOUSE JOINT RESOLUTION CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENT HC0061

Introduced , by Rep. Jim Durkin

## SYNOPSIS AS INTRODUCED:

ILCON Art. IV, Sec. 2.5 new ILCON Art. V, Sec. 2

Proposes to amend the Legislature and Executive Articles of the Illinois Constitution. Provides that a person may not be elected to the office of State Senator or State Representative, or a combination of those offices, for terms totalling more than 10 years; service before the second Wednesday in January of 2019 shall not be considered in the calculation of a person's service. Provides that a person may not be elected to any Executive Branch office, or any combination of Executive Branch offices, for terms totalling more than 8 years; service before the second Monday in January of 2019 shall not be considered in the calculation of a person's service.

- SECTION 2. TERMS 2
- 3 These elected officers of the Executive Branch shall hold 4 office for four years beginning on the second Monday of January 5 after their election and, except in the case of the Lieutenant 6 Governor, until their successors are qualified. They shall be 7 elected at the general election in 1978 and every four years 8 thereafter. A person may not be elected to any Executive Branch 9 office, or any combination of Executive Branch offices, for terms totalling more than 8 years. Service before the second 10

Monday in January of 2019 shall not be considered in the
