1 HOUSE RESOLUTION

- WHEREAS, The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention report that vaccinations are one of the best ways to put an end to the serious effects of certain diseases; and
- 5 WHEREAS, From January 1, 2015 to January 30, 2015, 102 6 people from 14 states were reported to have measles; and
- 7 WHEREAS, On January 23, 2015, the Centers for Disease 8 Control and Prevention issued a Health Advisory to notify 9 public health departments and healthcare facilities about this 10 multi-state outbreak and to provide guidance for healthcare 11 providers nationwide; and
- WHEREAS, The United States experienced a record number of measles cases during 2014, with 644 cases from 27 states reported to the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention's National Center for Immunization and Respiratory Diseases; this is the greatest number of cases since measles elimination was documented in the United States in 2000; and
 - WHEREAS, The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention's Advisory Committee on Immunization Practices reports that adolescents between 13 and 17 years of age routinely receive meningococcal conjugate, tetanus, diphtheria, and acellular

- 1 pertussis vaccines; and
