## HOUSE RESOLUTION

2 WHEREAS, In 1982, Congress designated June 6-12 as the 3 first National Child Abuse Prevention Week; the following year, 4 President Ronald Reagan proclaimed April to be the first 5 National Child Abuse Prevention Month, a tradition that 6 continues to this day; and

WHEREAS, Child abuse and neglect is a major social problem in Illinois, annually affecting 30,000 children in more than 17,000 families statewide; according to the Children's Bureau's Child Maltreatment 2013 Report, an estimated 1,520 children died as a result of abuse or neglect in the United States in 2013; and

WHEREAS, It is estimated that more than 100,000 cases of abuse go unreported each year; the impact of abuse on children manifests itself in many ways; the affected children may experience a range of emotional, psychological, and physical problems and trauma as a result of being abused or neglected; and

WHEREAS, There are various organizations and agencies that devote their full-hearted efforts to combating this vicious problem and seek to provide these at-risk children with options that help prevent and relieve afflicted children from the

- 2 WHEREAS, Organizations like the Children's Advocacy
- 3 Centers of Illinois, Children's Home + Aid, and Prevent Child
- 4 Abuse America have provided children and families the
- 5 opportunity of healing the wounds left from the harmful results
- of child neglect and abuse; and
- WHEREAS, Established in 1995, the Children's Advocacy
- 8 Centers of Illinois is a network that coordinates and provides
- 9 a comprehensive response to child abuse in Illinois through 37
- 10 locations in the State, working closely with the Department of
- 11 Children and Family Services and the Illinois Attorney
- 12 General's Office; and
- 13 WHEREAS, Children's Home + Aid has regional offices in
- 14 Bloomington, Rockford, Chicago, and Granite City; the
- organization is a leading child and family service agency in
- 16 Illinois; each year, it protects, educates, and counsels more
- 17 than 40,000 children, youth, and families to overcome the
- overwhelming obstacles of poverty, abuse, and neglect; and
- 19 WHEREAS, Founded in Chicago in 1972, Prevent Child Abuse
- 20 America works to ensure the healthy development of children
- 21 nationwide; the organization promotes this mission through a
- 22 network of chapters in 50 states and nearly 600 Healthy

- 1 Families America home visiting sites in 39 states, the District
- of Columbia, American Samoa, Guam, the Northern Commonwealth of
- 3 the Marianas, Puerto Rico, the United States Virgin Islands,
- 4 and Canada; and
- 5 WHEREAS, Illinois State law requires that Mandated
- 6 Reporters, including most professionals in education, health
- 7 care, law enforcement and social work, report suspected neglect
- 8 or abuse; and
- 9 WHEREAS, Health care professionals and concerned
- 10 individuals continue to try and raise awareness for and
- 11 education in emotional child abuse in the community and among
- 12 parents so as to produce a pro-active solution to the problem
- of child abuse and neglect; and
- 14 WHEREAS, The National Child Abuse Prevention Month is a
- time to acknowledge the importance of families and communities
- 16 working together to prevent child abuse and neglect, and to
- 17 promote the social and emotional well-being of children and
- 18 families; therefore, be it
- 19 RESOLVED, BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE
- 20 NINETY-NINTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, that we
- 21 designate the month of April in 2015 and 2016 as Child Abuse
- 22 Prevention Month in the State of Illinois; and be it further

- 1 RESOLVED, That we encourage communities throughout the
- 2 State to share child abuse and neglect prevention awareness
- 3 strategies and promote prevention across the State of Illinois.
