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HOUSE RESOLUTION

2 WHEREAS, In October of 2015, the National Down Syndrome 3 Society (NDSS) will be celebrating Down Syndrome Awareness 4 Month; and

5 WHEREAS, Down syndrome occurs when an individual has a full 6 or partial extra copy of chromosome 21; this additional genetic 7 material alters the course of development and causes the 8 characteristics typically associated with Down syndrome; and

9 WHEREAS, One in every 691 babies in the United States is 10 born with Down syndrome, making it the most common genetic 11 condition; approximately 400,000 Americans have Down syndrome 12 and about 6,000 babies with Down syndrome are born in the 13 United States each year; and

14 WHEREAS, Down syndrome occurs in people of all races and 15 economic levels; and

16 WHEREAS, The cause of the extra full or partial chromosome 17 is still unknown; maternal age is the only factor that has been 18 linked to an increased chance of having a baby with Down 19 syndrome; and

20 WHEREAS, People with Down syndrome have an increased risk

HR0821 -2-LRB099 14597 MST 38734 r 1 for certain medical conditions such as congenital heart 2 defects, respiratory and hearing problems, Alzheimer's disease, childhood leukemia, and thyroid conditions; many of 3 these conditions are now treatable, so many people with Down 4 5 syndrome lead healthy lives; life expectancy for people with Down syndrome has increased dramatically in recent decades -6 7 from 25 in 1983 to 60 today; and

8 WHEREAS, People with Down syndrome attend school, work, 9 participate in decisions that affect them, and contribute to 10 society in many wonderful ways; and

11 WHEREAS, Quality educational programs, a stimulating home 12 environment, good health care, and positive support from 13 family, friends, and the community enable people with Down 14 syndrome to develop their full potential and lead fulfilling 15 lives; therefore, be it

16 RESOLVED, BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE 17 NINETY-NINTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, that we 18 recognize the National Down Syndrome Society's October 2015 19 celebration of Down Syndrome Awareness Month; and be it further
