1 HOUSE RESOLUTION

2 WHEREAS, According to the United States Energy Information 3 Administration, Illinois is a key transportation hub for crude 4 oil and natural gas moving throughout North America, with more 5 than a dozen interstate natural gas pipelines, 2 natural gas 6 market centers, several petroleum and petroleum product 7 pipelines, and an oil port; and

- 8 WHEREAS, Illinois ranks fifth in the United States with 9 respect to population (12.8 million), GDP (\$730 billion), and 10 jobs related to exports (340,000); and
- 11 WHEREAS, Illinois' top exports, per the United States
 12 Department of Commerce, are petroleum products (#1) and crude
 13 oil (#5); in 2014, Illinois exported \$1.1 billion in crude oil,
 14 a 425% increase from 2013; and
- 15 WHEREAS, Illinois has the most oil refineries in the 16 Midwestern United States (4), with an aggregate crude oil 17 processing capacity of approximately one million barrels per 18 day; and
- 19 WHEREAS, Illinois is ranked fourth in oil refining capacity
 20 in the United States, as of January of 2014; and

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- 1 WHEREAS, In December of 2015, due to an unexpected increase 2 in United States crude oil stockpiles combined with a decision 3 from the Organization of Petroleum Exporting Countries to 4 maintain high levels of production, oil prices fell to below 5 \$38 per barrel, a decline of more than \$25 per barrel since 6 December of 2014; and
- WHEREAS, The United States is currently a party to 14 free trade agreements with 20 partner countries, which account for \$37.4 billion of Illinois' exports in 2014; and
- 10 WHEREAS, Under current United States law, there is a vague 11 ban on the export of United States crude stemming from the 1920 12 Mineral Leasing Act, the 1975 Energy Policy Conservation Act, 13 and the 1979 Export Administration Act; and
 - WHEREAS, There is currently an effort in the United States Congress to lift the export ban of United States crude oil; and
- 16 WHEREAS, Proponents of the ban assert that, among other things, such legislation is not needed at this time and 17 18 Congress should instead, among other things, end the 19 multi-billion dollar subsidies provided yearly oil companies; opponents of the ban assert that, among other 20 21 things, such legislation will, among other things, lower 22 gasoline prices across the country, give the United States

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- 1 greater foreign policy influence, and bolster United States
- 2 trade competitiveness and market access; therefore, be it
- 3 RESOLVED, BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES THE 4 NINETY-NINTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, that we 5 encourage a uniform, transparent, and modern process among the 6 U.S. State Department, the United States Department of 7 Commerce, the Federal Energy Regulatory Commission, and the 8 United States Department of Energy for licensing 9 exportation of crude oil produced in the United States and the

approval of cross-border pipelines; and be it further

RESOLVED, That suitable copies of this resolution be delivered to U.S. State Department, the United States

Department of Commerce, the Federal Energy Regulatory

Commission, the United States Department of Energy, the United

States Congressional Budget Office, and the United States

Government Accountability Office.
