## HOUSE RESOLUTION

2 WHEREAS, The members of the Illinois House of 3 Representatives are saddened to learn of the death of Henry 4 "Hank" Martinez; and

5 WHEREAS, Henry Martinez was born in Chicago to parents who 6 came from Guanajuato, Mexico; and

7 WHEREAS, Henry Martinez dedicated his life to provide 8 quidance for youth and to empower Latino communities; he was 9 the Founder and Executive Director of the Mexican Community 10 Committee, which was established to reduce crime and gang activity and was the first entity of its kind in the southeast 11 12 community of Chicago; he was the Founder and Director of the 13 Latino Resource Institute of Illinois, which also houses an 14 Illinois Welcoming Center and Family Advocacy Center; he served as Senior Supervisor at the Chicago Area Project, which 15 16 addresses juvenile delinquency in some of the poorest communities of the City of Chicago; he launched the first 17 Latino community college program in 18 southeast Chicago, 19 "Projecto Venceremos", which was later adopted by the City 20 Colleges of Chicago; he also served as part of Governor 21 Ogilvie's Spanish Speaking Peoples Study Commission in the 22 early 1970s, one of the first Latino commissions in the nation; 23 and

1 WHEREAS, Over 3 decades later, Henry Martinez became 2 convinced that Latinos needed a voice inside State government 3 more than ever, which led him to become the visionary force 4 behind the creation of the Illinois Latino Family Commission; 5 he began serving as the organization's chairman in 2010 and led 6 the efforts to fight for Latino equity and inclusion; and

7 WHEREAS, Henry Martinez served his country as a member of 8 the United States military during the Korean War: he 9 subsequently made it his mission to ensure that Latino veterans 10 have a voice and access to well-deserved support; he was the 11 founder of the Latino Veterans Committee of the Illinois Latino Family Commission to provide a forum to connect Latino veterans 12 13 throughout the State to resources and each other; he led the 14 efforts to establish a Vietnam veterans memorial in south 15 Chicago that stands as a testament today to his commitment to his fellow veterans; he was also an active member of the 16 17 American G.I. Forum and numerous boards, councils, and 18 commissions throughout his many years of service and advocacy; 19 and

20 WHEREAS, Henry Martinez graduated from Roosevelt 21 University and the University of Chicago and held a master's 22 degree in Juvenile Justice from Chicago State University; and

8 WHEREAS, Henry Martinez is survived by his wife, Linda; his 9 daughters, Alison and Kristal; and his new baby grandson; 10 therefore, be it
