WHEREAS, In 1931, a fire destroyed the Polish Library and National Museum at Alliance College in Cambridge Springs, Pennsylvania; the Polish-American community began looking for a new venue in the United States that would both promote Polish culture and history and the Polish presence in North America; and

WHEREAS, The Polish Museum of America was established in 1935 and officially opened its doors on January 12, 1937 as the Museum and Archives of the Polish Roman Catholic Union of America; and

WHEREAS, The Polish Museum of America is located in the heart of Chicago's historic Polish Downtown, a neighborhood that functions as Polish America's cultural capital; and

WHEREAS, The Polish Museum of America promotes the knowledge of Polish history and culture by offering paintings, sculptures, drawings, and lithographs by well-known artists; it offers exhibits such as lectures, movies and slide presentations, theater performances, and meetings with schools and people from all over the world who are dedicated to Polish Culture; and

WHEREAS, The Polish Museum of America serves as the focus of official commemorations of Casimir Pulaski Day, where various city and State officials congregate to pay tribute to Chicago's Polish Community; therefore, be it

RESOLVED, BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE NINETY-NINTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, that we recognize the Polish Museum of America and we wish them many more successful years; and be it further

RESOLVED, That a suitable copy of this resolution be presented to the Polish Museum of America as a symbol of our respect and esteem.
