1 AMENDMENT TO SENATE BILL 44

2 AMENDMENT NO. _____. Amend Senate Bill 44 by replacing
3 everything after the enacting clause with the following:

4 "Section 1. Short title. This Act may be cited as the
5 Unmanned Aerial System Oversight Task Force Act.

6 Section 5. Purpose. The use of drones is becoming more
7 common in everyday applications both commercially and
8 privately. It is clear that increased drone use creates
9 emerging conflicts and challenges to providing guidance into
10 the safe operation of drones, while not infringing upon the
11 constitutional rights of others. It is necessary to establish a
12 task force to provide oversight and input in creating
13 comprehensive laws and rules for the operation and use of drone
14 technology within this State, subject to federal oversight and
15 regulation.

1 Section 10. Definitions. As used in this Act:

2 "Task Force" means the Unmanned Aerial System Oversight
3 Task Force.

4 "Unmanned Aerial System" or "UAS" means an unmanned aerial
5 vehicle or drone.

6 Section 15. The Unmanned Aerial System Task Force.

7 (a) There is hereby created the Unmanned Aerial System
8 Oversight Task Force to study and make recommendations for the
9 operation, usage, and regulation of Unmanned Aerial Systems,
10 commonly referred to as "drone" technology, within this State.

11 (b) Within 90 days after the effective date of this Act
12 members of the Task Force shall be appointed by the Governor
13 and shall consist of one member from each of the following
14 agencies or interest groups:

15 (1) a member of the Division of Aeronautics of the
16 Department of Transportation, nominated by the Secretary
17 of Transportation;

18 (2) a member of the Department of State Police,
19 nominated by the Director of State Police;

20 (3) a Conservation Police officer of the Department of
21 Natural Resources, nominated by the Director of Natural
22 Resources;

23 (4) a member of the Department of Agriculture,
24 nominated by the Director of Agriculture;

25 (5) a member of the Department of Commerce and Economic

1 Opportunity, nominated by the Director of Commerce and
2 Economic Opportunity;

3 (6) a UAS technical commercial representative;

4 (7) a UAS manufacturing industry representative;

5 (8) a person nominated by the Attorney General;

6 (9) a member of the Illinois Conservation Police Lodge,
7 nominated by the president of the Lodge;

8 (10) a member of a statewide sportsmen's federation,
9 nominated by the president of the federation;

10 (11) a member of a statewide agricultural association,
11 nominated by the president of the association;

12 (12) a member of a statewide commerce association,
13 nominated by the president or executive director of the
14 association; and

15 (13) a person nominated by an electric utility company
16 serving retail customers in this State.

17 (c) Nominations to the Task Force must be submitted to the
18 Governor within 60 days of the effective date of this Act. The
19 Governor shall make the appointments within 30 days after the
20 close of nominations. The term of the appointment shall be
21 until submission of the report of comprehensive
22 recommendations under subsection (f) of this Section. The
23 member from the Division of Aeronautics of the Department of
24 Transportation shall chair the Task Force and serve as a
25 liaison to the Governor and General Assembly. Meetings of the
26 Task Force shall be held as necessary to complete the duties of

1 the Task Force. Meetings of the Task Force shall be held in the
2 central part of the State.

3 (d) The members of the Task Force shall receive no
4 compensation for serving as members of the Task Force.

5 (e) The Task Force shall consider commercial and private
6 uses of drones, landowner and privacy rights, as well as
7 general rules and regulations for safe operation of drones, and
8 prepare comprehensive recommendations for the safe and lawful
9 operation of UAS in this State.

10 (f) The Task Force shall submit a report with
11 recommendations to the Governor and General Assembly no later
12 than July 1, 2016.

13 Section 20. Expiration. This Act is repealed on September
14 1, 2016.

15 Section 99. Effective date. This Act takes effect upon
16 becoming law."
