SYNOPSIS AS INTRODUCED:

105 ILCS 5/27-3	from Ch. 122, par. 27-3
105 ILCS 5/27A-11.10 new	

Amends the School Code. In provisions that prohibit a student from receiving a certificate of graduation without passing a satisfactory examination upon the subjects of American patriotism and the principles of representative government and the proper use and display of the American flag, provides that the examination for high school students must include test questions that are identical to the 100 test questions listed in the civics portion of the naturalization test used by the United States Citizenship and Immigration Services, and a pupil may not be considered to have satisfactorily passed the examination without correctly answering at least 60 of those 100 questions. Also requires this testing in charter schools.

2 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, 3 represented in the General Assembly:

- Section 5. The School Code is amended by changing Section
 27-3 and by adding Section 27A-11.10 follows:

7 Sec. 27-3. Patriotism and principles of representative government - Proper use of flag - Method of voting - Pledge of 8 9 Allegiance. American patriotism and the principles of 10 representative government, as enunciated in the American Declaration of Independence, the Constitution of the United 11 States of America and the Constitution of the State of 12 Illinois, and the proper use and display of the American flag, 13 14 shall be taught in all public schools and other educational institutions supported or maintained in whole or in part by 15 16 public funds. No student shall receive a certificate of 17 graduation without passing a satisfactory examination upon such subjects. Beginning with the 2016-2017 school year, the 18 19 examination for high school students must include test 20 questions that are identical to the 100 test questions listed 21 in the civics portion of the naturalization test used by the 22 United States Citizenship and Immigration Services, and a pupil may not be considered to have satisfactorily passed the 23

1 <u>examination without correctly answering at least 60 of those</u> 2 100 questions.

3 Instruction shall be given in all such schools and 4 institutions in the method of voting at elections by means of 5 the Australian Ballot system and the method of the counting of 6 votes for candidates.

7 The Pledge of Allegiance shall be recited each school day 8 by pupils in elementary and secondary educational institutions 9 supported or maintained in whole or in part by public funds.

Beginning with the 2016-2017 school year, no charter school student may receive a 13 certificate of high school graduation without satisfactorily 14 15 passing an examination that includes test questions that are 16 identical to the 100 test questions listed in the civics 17 portion of the naturalization test used by the United States Citizenship and Immigration Services. A pupil may not be 18 19 considered to have satisfactorily passed the examination without correctly answering at least 60 of those 100 questions. 20
