Amend Senate Bill 1430 by replacing 2 everything after the enacting clause with the following: 3 "Section 5. The Property Tax Code is amended by changing 4 Section 3-70 as follows: 5 6 (35 ILCS 200/3-70) 7 Sec. 3-70. Cessation of Township Assessor. (a) If the office of Township Assessor in a coterminous 8 township ceases as provided in Article 27 of the Township Code, 10 then the coterminous municipality shall assume the duties of the Township Assessor under this Code. 11 12 (b) If the office of Township Assessor ceases as provided 13 in Article 28 of the Township Code, then the Supervisor of Assessments or County Assessor, as applicable, shall assume the 14 15 duties of the Township Assessor under this Code. - 1 Section 10. The Township Code is amended by adding Article
- 2 28 as follows:

- 4 ARTICLE 28. DISCONTINUANCE OF THE OFFICE OF TOWNSHIP ASSESSOR
- 5 (60 ILCS 1/28-5 new)
- 6 Sec. 28-5. Referendum to discontinue all offices of
- 7 township assessor in a county.
- 8 (a) The office of township assessor may be discontinued by
- 9 referendum in all townships lying wholly within a county's
- 10 borders upon (i) adoption of a resolution by the county board
- 11 for the voters to approve by referendum the discontinuance of
- 12 all township assessors, or (ii) filing of a petition, subject
- to the petition requirements of Section 28-3 of the Election
- 14 <u>Code</u>, with the county board to approve by referendum the
- discontinuance of all township assessors signed by at least 10%
- of the registered voters of the county.
- 17 (b) Upon adoption of the resolution or filing of the
- 18 petition under subsection (a), the county board shall certify
- 19 the question to the appropriate election officials and file
- 20 with the county clerk. The resolution or petition shall be
- 21 filed with the county clerk not less than 79 days prior to the
- 22 general election in which the referendum will appear.

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Sec. 28-10. Referendum; approval. If a petition for a referendum is filed with the county clerk that meets the requirements of Section 27-5 of this Article, a referendum, subject to the requirements of 16-7 of the Election Code, shall be placed on the ballot at the next general election in substantially the following form:

Shall the office of township assessor be abolished in all townships in ... County and the duties of each township assessor be transferred to the county assessor or county supervisor of assessments.

The votes shall be recorded as "Yes" or "No." The referendum is approved when a majority of the voters approve of the referendum. If approved, then the office of township assessor shall cease in each township in the county at the end of the current term of office of each township assessor. At the end of each township assessor's term (i) the county supervisor of assessments or county assessor, as applicable, shall assume the duties of the township assessor under the Property Tax Code, (ii) the county board members shall be the board of health for the public health district under the Public Health District Act, and (iii) the Office of the Township Collector shall also cease.

Section 15. The Public Health District Act is amended by adding Section 27 as follows:

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Sec. 27. Cessation of township assessor. If the office of 2 township assessor ceases as provided in Article 28 of the 3 Township Code, then the county board members shall be the board 4

of health for the public health district under this Act.".
