

99TH GENERAL ASSEMBLY State of Illinois 2015 and 2016 SB1657

SYNOPSIS AS INTRODUCED:

725 ILCS 5/115-25 new

Amends the Code of Criminal Procedure of 1963. Requires a party seeking to impeach a witness with the witness's illegal immigration status to first attempt to obtain a stipulation regarding the witness's immigration status from the party offering the witness. If a stipulation is agreed to and signed, a party may not question the witness regarding his or her illegal immigration status. Requires the stipulation to be presented to the trier-of-fact immediately after the testimony of the witness. Effective immediately.

1 AN ACT concerning criminal law.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, represented in the General Assembly:

- 4 Section 1. The reporting of criminal activity and 5 cooperation with the judicial process by every person in this State is a legitimate interest that needs to be protected. The 6 7 current laws of this State discourage individuals whose 8 immigration status is in question from reporting crimes or witness 9 testifying to events they for fear 10 self-incriminating statements related to immigration consequences. This Act addresses the immigration status of 11 potential witnesses while encouraging cooperation with law 12 enforcement officers and the courts. 13
- Section 5. The Code of Criminal Procedure of 1963 is amended by adding Section 115-25 as follows:
- 16 (725 ILCS 5/115-25 new)
- Sec. 115-25. Immigration status impeachment; stipulation;

 burden of proof. A party seeking to impeach a witness with the

 witness's illegal immigration status may do so on

 cross-examination only if the party offering the witness

 refuses to stipulate to that status to the trier-of-fact. The

 party seeking to introduce a witness's illegal immigration

- 1 status has the burden of proving that status by a preponderance
- of the evidence. If the party offering the witness agrees to
- 3 and signs the stipulation, the opposing party may not question
- 4 the witness regarding his or her illegal immigration status.
- 5 The stipulation must be presented to the trier-of-fact
- 6 <u>immediately after the testimony of the witness. Nothing in this</u>
- 7 Section shall be construed to affect the discovery obligations
- 8 of the parties.
- 9 Section 99. Effective date. This Act takes effect upon
- 10 becoming law.
