16 Section 75. The amount of \$5,300,000, or so much thereof 17 as may be necessary, is appropriated from the SBE Federal 18 Agency Services Fund to the Illinois State Board of Education 19 for all costs associated with the Substance Abuse and Mental 20 Health Services.

21 Section 80. The amount of \$500,000, or so much thereof 22 as may be necessary, is appropriated from the SBE Federal
