SYNOPSIS AS INTRODUCED:

225 ILCS 85/16c

Amends the Pharmacy Practice Act. Extends the repeal of the medicine locking closure package pilot program from January 1, 2017 to January 1, 2018. Effective immediately.

AN ACT concerning regulation.

2 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, 3 represented in the General Assembly:

Section 5. The Pharmacy Practice Act is amended by changing
Section 16c as follows:

6 (225 ILCS 85/16c)

7 (Section scheduled to be repealed on January 1, 2017)

8 Sec. 16c. Medicine locking closure package.

9 (a) As used in this Section:

10 "Medicine locking closure package" means any alphanumeric 11 combination locking closure mechanism that can only be unlocked 12 with a user-generated, resettable alphanumeric code in 13 combination with an amber prescription container that forms a 14 package that allows only the person with a prescription access 15 to the medicine.

16 "Schedule II controlled substance" means a Schedule II 17 controlled substance under the United States Controlled 18 Substances Act and 21 CFR 1308.

(b) Subject to appropriation, effective January 1, 2016, the Department shall by rule implement a pilot project requiring that every new or refilled prescription for a Schedule II controlled substance containing hydrocodone dispensed by a pharmacy that voluntarily decides to participate in the pilot program shall only be dispensed in a non-reusable medicine locking closure package. The Department shall not expend more than \$150,000 on this pilot program. The Department may contract with third parties to implement the pilot program in whole or in part.

6 (c) The medicine locking closure package must be dispensed 7 by the pharmacy with instructions for patient use unless the 8 prescriber indicates orally, in writing, or electronically 9 that a medicine locking closure package shall not be used.

10 (d) The manufacturer of the medicine locking closure 11 package must make available assistance online or through a 12 toll-free number for patient use.

(e) Prescriptions reimbursed via the Medicare Part D and
Medicaid programs, including Medicaid managed care plans, are
exempt from the provisions of this Section.

16 (f) Prescriptions for individuals residing in facilities 17 licensed under the Nursing Home Care Act are exempt from the 18 provisions of this Section.

(g) This Section is repealed on January 1, <u>2018</u> 2017.
