- 1 Section 5. The sum of \$4,969,000, or so much thereof as
- 2 may be necessary, is appropriated from the General Revenue
- 3 Fund to the Office of the Governor for operational expenses
- 4 of the fiscal year ending June 30, 2016.
- 5 Section 10. The sum of \$100,000, or so much thereof as
- 6 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Governor's Grant
- 7 Fund to the Office of the Governor to be expended in
- 8 accordance with the terms and conditions upon which such
- 9 funds were received and in the exercise of the powers or
- 10 performance of the duties of the Office of the Governor.
- 11 Section 99. Effective Date. This Act takes effect July
- 12 1, 2016, if and only if Senate Bill 2789 of the 99th General
- 13 Assembly (the Unbalanced Budget Response Act), as introduced
- in the Illinois Senate, becomes law.
