Amends the Herptiles-Herps Act. Provides that "administrative rule" means a rule adopted under the Illinois Administrative Procedure Act.

1 AN ACT concerning animals.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, represented in the General Assembly:

- 4 Section 5. The Herptiles-Herps Act is amended by changing
- 5 Section 1-15 as follows:
- 6 (510 ILCS 68/1-15)
- 7 Sec. 1-15. Definitions. For the purposes of this Act,
- 8 unless the context clearly requires otherwise, the following
- 9 terms are defined as:
- 10 "Administrative rule" means a <u>rule adopted under the</u>
- 11 <u>Illinois Administrative Procedure</u> regulatory measure issued by
- 12 the Director under this Act.
- 13 "Authorized law enforcement officer" means all sworn
- 14 members of the Law Enforcement Division of the Department and
- 15 those persons specifically granted law enforcement
- 16 authorization by the Director.
- 17 "Bona fide scientific or educational institution" means
- 18 confirming educational or scientific tax-exemption, from the
- 19 federal Internal Revenue Service or the applicant's national,
- 20 state, or local tax authority, or a statement of accreditation
- or recognition as an educational institution.
- 22 "Contraband" means all reptile or amphibian life or any
- 23 part of reptile or amphibian life taken, bought, sold or

- 1 bartered, shipped, or held in possession or any conveyance,
- 2 vehicle, watercraft, or other means of transportation
- 3 whatsoever, except sealed railroad cars or other sealed common
- 4 carriers, used to transport or ship any reptile or amphibian
- 5 life or any part of reptile or amphibian life taken, contrary
- 6 to this Act, including administrative rules, or used to
- 7 transport, contrary to this Act, including administrative
- 8 rules, any of the specified species when taken illegally.
- 9 "Culling" means picking out from others and removing
- 10 rejected members because of inferior quality.
- 11 "Department" means the Illinois Department of Natural
- 12 Resources.
- "Director" means the Director of the Illinois Department of
- 14 Natural Resources.
- 15 "Educational program" means a program of organized
- instruction or study for providing education intended to meet a
- 17 public need.
- "Endangered or threatened species" means any species
- 19 listed as endangered or threatened to the species level on
- 20 either the Illinois List of Endangered and Threatened Fauna or
- 21 the federal U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service List of Threatened
- 22 and Endangered Species.
- "Herptile" means collectively any amphibian or reptile
- taxon, whether indigenous to this State or not.
- 25 "Indigenous or native taxa" means those amphibians and
- 26 reptiles to the subspecies level that can be found naturally in

- 1 this State.
- 2 "Individual" means a natural person.
- 3 "Medically significant" means a venomous or poisonous
- 4 species whose venom or toxin can cause death or serious illness
- or injury in humans that may require emergency room care or the
- 6 immediate care of a physician. These species are categorized as
- 7 being "medically significant" or "medically important".
- 8 "Owner" means an individual who has a legal right to the
- 9 possession of a herptile.
- 10 "Person" means any individual, partnership, corporation,
- organization, trade or professional association, firm, limited
- 12 liability company, joint venture, or group.
- "Possession limit" means the maximum number or amount of
- 14 herptiles that can be lawfully held or possessed by one person
- 15 at any time.
- 16 "Possessor" means any person who possesses, keeps,
- harbors, brings into the State, cares for, acts as a custodian
- for, has in his or her custody or control, or holds a property
- 19 right to a herptile.
- 20 "Reptile show" means any event open to the public, for a
- 21 fee or without a fee, that is not a licensed pet store, where
- 22 herptiles or herptiles together with other animals are
- 23 exhibited, displayed, sold, bought, traded, or otherwise made
- 24 available for public display.
- "Resident" means a person who in good faith makes
- application for any license or permit and verifies by statement

that he or she has maintained his or her permanent abode in 1 2 this State for a period of at least 30 consecutive days 3 immediately preceding the person's application, and who does not maintain permanent abode or claim residency in another 5 state for the purposes of obtaining any of the same or similar licenses or permits under this Act. A person's permanent abode 6 7 is his or her fixed and permanent dwelling place, as 8 distinguished from a temporary or transient place of residence. 9 Domiciliary intent is required to establish that the person is 10 maintaining his or her permanent abode in this State. Evidence 11 of domiciliary intent includes, but is not limited to, the 12 location where the person votes, pays personal income tax, or 13 obtains a drivers license. Any person on active duty in the Armed Forces shall be considered a resident of Illinois during 14 15 his or her period of military duty.

"Special use herptile" means any taxon of amphibian or reptile for which a Herptile Special Use permit is required.

"Take" means possess, collect, catch, detain, hunt, shoot, pursue, lure, kill, destroy, capture, gig or spear, trap or ensnare, harass, or an attempt to do so.

"Transport" or "ship" means to convey by parcel post, express, freight, baggage, or shipment by common carrier or any description; by automobile, motorcycle, or other vehicle of any kind; by water or aircraft of any kind; or by any other means of transportation.

"Turtle farming" means the act of breeding, hatching,

- raising, selling turtles, or any combination commercially for the purpose of providing turtles, turtle eggs, or turtle parts to pet suppliers, exporters, and food industries.
- "Wildlife sanctuary" means any non-profit organization 4 5 that: (1) is exempt from taxation under the federal Internal Revenue Code and is currently confirmed as tax exempt by the 6 federal Internal Revenue Service; (2) operates a place of 7 8 refuge where wild animals are provided care for their lifetime 9 or released back to their natural range; (3) does not conduct 10 activities on animals in its possession that are not inherent 11 to the animal's nature; (4) does not use animals in its 12 possession for entertainment; (5) does not sell, trade, or 13 barter animals in its possession or parts of those animals; and 14 (6) does not breed animals in its possession.
