SENATE JOINT RESOLUTION NO. 20 1 2 (As Amended by Senate Amendment No. 1) 3 WHEREAS, The Illinois Public Agenda for College and Career 4 Success has documented the critical role that higher education 5 plays in economic recovery and growth, particularly in ensuring 6 that this State has an educated workforce to meet the needs of 7 business and industry; and 8 WHEREAS, The Illinois Public Agenda for College and Career 9 Success recommends that the Board of Higher Education, in 10 consultation with other State agencies for education, 11 employment, and economic development, "increase the number of high-quality post-secondary credentials to meet the demands of 12 13 the economy and an increasingly global society"; and 14 WHEREAS, Illinois has committed to the goal that 60% of its workforce will hold a high-quality college credential by 2025 15 to ensure its economic future; and 16 WHEREAS, Most recent projections from the Georgetown 17 18 University Center on Education and the Workforce are that 70% 19 of Illinois jobs will require post-secondary education by 2020; 20 and

WHEREAS, Currently, only 42.5% of the State's nearly 7

- 19 Presidents has recommended that the community college system be
- 20 allowed to grant 4-year baccalaureate degrees for nursing and

1 WHEREAS, The development of post-secondary degree programs should be predicated on evidence of the needs of Illinois 2 residents rather than institutional interests; and 3

WHEREAS, The Illinois Board of Higher Education has the statutory authority and responsibility to review all applications for new academic degree programs for public community colleges and universities; therefore, be it

RESOLVED, BY THE SENATE OF THE NINETY-NINTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES CONCURRING HEREIN, that there is created the Higher Education Commission on the Future of the Workforce within the Board of Higher Education; and be it further

RESOLVED, That the Commission shall be comprised of 11 members, including one senator appointed by the President of the Senate; one senator appointed by the Minority Leader of the Senate; one representative appointed by the Speaker of the House; one representative appointed by the Minority Leader of the House; and 7 members appointed by the Board of Higher represent a cross-section from education, Education to including at least one member from a community college, one member from a public university, and one member from a private institution of higher education, as well as members of the 5
