1 SENATE RESOLUTION

2 WHEREAS, The members of the Illinois Senate are saddened to 3 learn of the death of Howard D. Eskridge of Tuscola, who passed 4 away on December 9, 2016; and

WHEREAS, Howard Eskridge was born in Decatur to Homer and Grace (Howell) Eskridge on May 15, 1945; he received his Bachelor of Science in Business from Millikin University and his master's degree in public administration from Governors State University; he married Kathryn Meyer in 1979; he married Judy (Blain) Henderson in Arcola on June 29, 1986; and

WHEREAS, Howard Eskridge lived his boyhood dream of wanting to be a firefighter by spending 30 years as a firefighter instructor at the University of Illinois Fire Service Institute; his work, along with others, lead to many programs, including basic, standard and advanced level firefighter certification; as a State training instructor, his influence and expertise was often called on to assist fire departments with incidents or designing other training programs; at the age of 21, he was the youngest paid fire chief in the State of Illinois for Hammond; and

WHEREAS, Following his retirement from the University of Illinois Fire Service Institute, Howard Eskridge worked

- 1 part-time for Ruhl Forensic and Depke Welding; and
- WHEREAS, Howard Eskridge was in the United States Navy
 Construction Battalions (SEABEES) from 1967 to 1969; he proudly
 wore his Vietnam Navy Veterans hat and always enjoyed
 interacting with other veterans; his patriotism was an
 important part of his life and he helped lay to rest many
 service members; and
 - WHEREAS, Howard Eskridge had many hobbies and talents; he taught himself to weld and keep farm machinery running; his favorite pastime was communicating with people all over the world as an amateur radio operator (K9GYI) from his Chicken Bristle Radio Shack; other talents included public speaking and writing poetry; his greatest joy was living in the country, where he could mow, trim, and work in his shop; and
 - WHEREAS, Howard Eskridge was a member of the Arcola United Methodist Church, where he once served as lay leader and narrated choir cantatas for many years; he was also a member of the American Radio Relay League and Arcola VFW Post #7680; and
 - WHEREAS, Howard Eskridge is survived by his wife, Judy; his daughters, Kendra Chriss, and Jodi Samsa; his granddaughters, Elise Chriss, and Ava Samsa; his sister, Judy Day; and several nieces and nephews; therefore, be it
