AN ACT to amend the State Finance Act by changing Section
 8.3.

3 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois,4 represented in the General Assembly:

5 Section 5. The State Finance Act is amended by changing
6 Section 8.3 as follows:

7 (30 ILCS 105/8.3) (from Ch. 127, par. 144.3)

8 Sec. 8.3. Money in the Road Fund shall, if and when the State of Illinois incurs any bonded indebtedness for the 9 construction of permanent highways, be set aside and used for 10 the purpose of paying and discharging annually the principal 11 and interest on that bonded indebtedness then due and 12 13 payable, and for no other purpose. The surplus, if any, in the Road Fund after the payment of principal and interest on 14 15 that bonded indebtedness then annually due shall be used as follows: 16

17 first -- to pay the cost of administration of 18 Chapters 2 through 10 of the Illinois Vehicle Code, 19 except the cost of administration of Articles I and II of 20 Chapter 3 of that Code; and

secondly -- for expenses of the Department of 21 22 Transportation for construction, reconstruction, 23 improvement, repair, maintenance, operation, and highways in accordance with the 24 administration of provisions of laws relating thereto, or for any purpose 25 related or incident to and connected therewith, including 26 27 the separation of grades of those highways with railroads and with highways and including the payment of awards 28 made by the Industrial Commission under the terms of the 29 Workers' Compensation Act or Workers' Occupational 30 Diseases Act for injury or death of an employee of the 31

1 Division of Highways in the Department of Transportation; 2 or for the acquisition of land and the erection of buildings for highway purposes, including the acquisition 3 4 of highway right-of-way or for investigations to determine the reasonably anticipated future highway 5 needs; or for making of surveys, plans, specifications 6 7 and estimates for and in the construction and maintenance 8 of flight strips and of highways necessary to provide 9 access to military and naval reservations, to defense industries and defense-industry sites, and to the sources 10 11 of raw materials and for replacing existing highways and highway connections shut off from general public use at 12 military and naval reservations and defense-industry 13 sites, or for the purchase of right-of-way, except that 14 the State shall be reimbursed in full for any expense 15 16 incurred in building the flight strips; or for the operating and maintaining of highway garages; or for 17 patrolling and policing the public highways and 18 conserving the peace; or for any of those purposes or any 19 other purpose that may be provided by law. 20

Appropriations for any of those purposes are payable from the Road Fund. Appropriations may also be made from the Road Fund for the administrative expenses of any State agency that are related to motor vehicles or arise from the use of motor vehicles.

Beginning with fiscal year 1980 and thereafter, no Road 26 27 Fund monies shall be appropriated the following to agencies 28 Departments or of State government for 29 administration, grants, or operations; but this limitation is 30 not a restriction upon appropriating for those purposes any Road Fund monies that are eligible for federal reimbursement; 31

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- 1. Department of Public Health;

33 2. Department of Transportation, only with respect34 to subsidies for one-half fare Student Transportation and

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Reduced Fare for Elderly;

3. Department of Central Management Services,
 except for expenditures incurred for group insurance
 premiums of appropriate personnel;

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4. Judicial Systems and Agencies.

6 Beginning with fiscal year 1981 and thereafter, no Road 7 Fund monies shall be appropriated to the following agencies 8 Departments or of State government for 9 administration, grants, or operations; but this limitation is not a restriction upon appropriating for those purposes any 10 Road Fund monies that are eligible for federal reimbursement: 11

Department of State Police, except for
 expenditures with respect to the Division of Operations;
 Department of Transportation, only with respect

to Intercity Rail Subsidies and Rail Freight Services.

16 Beginning with fiscal year 1982 and thereafter, no Road Fund monies shall be appropriated 17 to the following 18 Departments or agencies of State government for 19 administration, grants, or operations; but this limitation is not a restriction upon appropriating for those purposes any 20 21 Road Fund monies that are eligible for federal reimbursement: Department of Central Management Services, except for awards 22 23 made by the Industrial Commission under the terms of the Workers' Compensation Act or Workers' Occupational Diseases 24 25 Act for injury or death of an employee of the Division of Highways in the Department of Transportation. 26

Beginning with fiscal year 1984 and thereafter, no Road 27 Fund monies shall be appropriated to 28 the following 29 Departments or agencies of State government for 30 administration, grants, or operations; but this limitation is not a restriction upon appropriating for those purposes any 31 Road Fund monies that are eligible for federal reimbursement: 32 1. Department of State Police, except not more than 33 40% the funds appropriated for the Division of 34 of

1 Operations;

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2. State Officers.

Beginning with fiscal year 1984 and thereafter, no Road 3 4 Fund monies shall be appropriated to any Department or agency of State government for administration, grants, or operations 5 б except as provided hereafter; but this limitation is not a restriction upon appropriating for those purposes any Road 7 Fund monies that are eligible for federal reimbursement. 8 It 9 shall not be lawful to circumvent the above appropriation limitations by governmental reorganization or other methods. 10 11 Appropriations shall be made from the Road Fund only in accordance with the provisions of this Section. 12

Money in the Road Fund shall, if and when the State of 13 Illinois incurs any bonded indebtedness for the construction 14 of permanent highways, be set aside and used for the purpose 15 16 of paying and discharging during each fiscal year the principal and interest on that bonded indebtedness as it 17 becomes due and payable as provided in the Transportation 18 19 Bond Act, and for no other purpose. The surplus, if any, in the Road Fund after the payment of principal and interest on 20 21 that bonded indebtedness then annually due shall be used as 22 follows:

23 first -- to pay the cost of administration of Chapters 2 through 10 of the Illinois Vehicle Code; and 24 25 secondly -- no Road Fund monies derived from fees, excises, or license taxes relating to registration, 26 operation and use of vehicles on public highways or to 27 fuels used for the propulsion of those vehicles, shall be 28 appropriated or expended other than for costs 29 of 30 administering the laws imposing those fees, excises, and license taxes, statutory refunds and adjustments allowed 31 thereunder, administrative costs of the Department of 32 Transportation, payment of debts and liabilities incurred 33 in construction and reconstruction of public highways and 34

1 bridges, acquisition of rights-of-way for and the cost of 2 construction, reconstruction, maintenance, repair, and operation of public highways and bridges under the 3 4 direction and supervision of the State, political subdivision, or municipality collecting those monies, and 5 the costs for patrolling and policing the public highways 6 7 (by State, political subdivision, or municipality collecting that money) for enforcement of traffic laws. 8 9 The separation of grades of such highways with railroads and costs associated with protection of at-grade highway 10 11 and railroad crossing shall also be permissible.

12 Appropriations for any of such purposes are payable from 13 the Road Fund or the Grade Crossing Protection Fund as 14 provided in Section 8 of the Motor Fuel Tax Law.

Beginning with fiscal year 1991 and thereafter, no 15 Road 16 Fund monies shall be appropriated to the Department of State Police for the purposes of this Section in excess of 17 its total fiscal year 1990 Road Fund appropriations for those 18 19 purposes unless otherwise provided in Section 5g of this Act. It shall not be lawful to circumvent this limitation on 20 21 appropriations by governmental reorganization or other methods unless otherwise provided in Section 5g of this Act. 22

In fiscal year 1994, no Road Fund monies shall be 23 appropriated to the Secretary of State for the purposes of 24 25 this Section in excess of the total fiscal year 1991 Road Fund appropriations to the Secretary of State for those 26 purposes, plus \$9,800,000. 27 It shall not be lawful to circumvent this limitation on appropriations by governmental 28 reorganization or other method. 29

30 Beginning with fiscal year 1995 and thereafter, no Road 31 Fund monies shall be appropriated to the Secretary of State 32 for the purposes of this Section in excess of the total 33 fiscal year 1994 Road Fund appropriations to the Secretary of 34 State for those purposes. It shall not be lawful to

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circumvent this limitation on appropriations by governmental
 reorganization or other methods.
 Beginning with fiscal year 2000, total Road Fund
 appropriations to the Secretary of State for the purposes of

this Section shall not exceed the amounts specified for the

6 following fiscal years: 7 \$80,500,000; Fiscal Year 2000 Fiscal Year 2001 \$80,500,000; 8 9 Fiscal Year 2002 \$80,500,000; Fiscal Year 2003 \$80,500,000; 10 11 Fiscal Year 2004 <u>\$64,400,000;</u> 12 Fiscal Year 2005 <u>\$48,300,000;</u> Fiscal Year 2006 13 <u>\$32,200,000;</u> Fiscal Year 2007 \$16,100,000; 14 15 Fiscal Year 2008; and

16 each year thereafter <u>\$0</u> \$30,500,000.
17 It shall not be lawful to circumvent this limitation on
18 appropriations by governmental reorganization or other
19 methods.

20 No new program may be initiated in fiscal year 1991 and 21 thereafter that is not consistent with the limitations 22 imposed by this Section for fiscal year 1984 and thereafter, 23 insofar as appropriation of Road Fund monies is concerned.

Nothing in this Section prohibits transfers from the Road Fund to the State Construction Account Fund under Section 5e of this Act.

Beginning with fiscal year 2004 and thereafter, no Road 27 28 Fund moneys may be appropriated to the Department of Central Management Services, the Department of Employment Security, 29 30 the Department of Revenue, the Court of Claims, or any other 31 State agency (other than the Department of State Police and 32 the Department of Transportation and, until fiscal year 2008, the Secretary of State) for the purposes of this Section. 33 Appropriations to those entities for those purposes shall, 34

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1 instead, be made from the General Revenue Fund. It shall not 2 be lawful to circumvent this limitation on appropriations by governmental reorganization or other methods. Nothing in 3 4 this paragraph prohibits appropriations from the Road Fund to 5 the Department of State Police for the purposes of the б highway patrol budget only. 7 Beginning with fiscal year 2008 and thereafter, no Road 8 Fund moneys may be appropriated to the Secretary of State for the purposes of this Section. Appropriations to the 9 Secretary of State for those purposes shall, instead, be made 10 from the General Revenue Fund. Is shall not be lawful to 11 circumvent this limitation on appropriations by governmental 12 13 reorganization or other methods.
