- 2 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois,
- 3 represented in the General Assembly:
- 4 Section 5. The School Code is amended by changing
- 5 Section 2-3.66 as follows:

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- 6 (105 ILCS 5/2-3.66) (from Ch. 122, par. 2-3.66)
- Sec. 2-3.66. Truants' alternative and optional education
- 8 programs. To establish pilot projects to offer modified
- 9 instructional programs or other services designed to prevent
- 10 students from dropping out of school, including programs
- 11 pursuant to Section 2-3.41 of this Code, and to serve as a
- 12 part time or full time option in lieu of regular school
- 13 attendance and to award grants to local school districts,
- 14 educational service regions or community college districts
- 15 from appropriated funds to assist districts in establishing
- 16 such projects. The education agency may operate its own
- 17 program or enter into a contract with another not-for-profit
- 18 entity to implement the program. The pilot projects shall

allow dropouts, up to and including age 21, potential

School districts which are awarded grants pursuant to this Section shall be authorized to provide day care 7 services to children of students who are eligible and desire 8 9 to enroll in programs established and funded under this Section, but only if and to the extent that such day care is 10 11 necessary to enable those eligible students to attend and participate in the programs and courses which are conducted 12 pursuant to this Section. The Board shall report on the 13 status of the pilot projects pursuant to Section 1A-4. School 14 districts and regional offices of education may claim general 15 State aid under Section 18-8.05 for students enrolled in 16 alternative and optional education programs, 17 provided that such students are receiving services that are 18 19 supplemental to a program leading to a high school diploma and are otherwise eligible to be claimed for general State 20
