- 1 AN ACT concerning corrections.
- 2 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois,
- 3 represented in the General Assembly:
- 4 Section 5. The Unified Code of Corrections is amended by
- 5 changing Section 3-7-2 as follows:
- 6 (730 ILCS 5/3-7-2) (from Ch. 38, par. 1003-7-2)
- 7 Sec. 3-7-2. Facilities.
- 8 (a) All institutions and facilities of the Department
- 9 shall provide every committed person with access to toilet
- 10 facilities, barber facilities, bathing facilities at least
- once each week, a library of legal materials and published
- 12 materials including newspapers and magazines approved by the
- 13 Director. A committed person may not receive any materials
- 14 that the Director deems pornographic.
- 15 (b) (Blank).
- 16 (c) All institutions and facilities of the Department
- shall provide facilities for every committed person to leave
- 18 his cell for at least one hour each day unless the chief
- 19 administrative officer determines that it would be harmful or
- 20 dangerous to the security or safety of the institution or
- 21 facility.
- 22 (d) All institutions and facilities of the Department
- 23 shall provide every committed person with a wholesome and
- 24 nutritional diet at regularly scheduled hours, drinking
- 25 water, clothing adequate for the season, bedding, soap and
- towels and medical and dental care.
- (e) All institutions and facilities of the Department
- 28 shall permit every committed person to send and receive an
- 29 unlimited number of uncensored letters, provided, however,
- 30 that the Director may order that mail be inspected and read
- 31 for reasons of the security, safety or morale of the

- 2 (f) All of the institutions and facilities of the
- 3 Department shall permit every committed person to receive
- 4 visitors, except in case of abuse of the visiting privilege
- or when the chief administrative officer determines that such
- 6 visiting would be harmful or dangerous to the security,
- 7 safety or morale of the institution or facility. The chief
- 8 administrative officer shall have the right to restrict
- 9 visitation to non-contact visits for reasons of safety,
- 10 security, and order, including, but not limited to,
- 11 restricting contact visits for committed persons engaged in
- 12 gang activity.
- 13 (g) All institutions and facilities of the Department
- 14 shall permit religious ministrations and sacraments to be
- 15 available to every committed person, but attendance at
- 16 religious services shall not be required.
- 17 (h) Within 90 days after December 31, 1996, the
- 18 Department shall prohibit the use of curtains,
- 19 cell-coverings, or any other matter or object that obstructs
- 20 or otherwise impairs the line of vision into a committed
- 21 person's cell.
- 22 (i) A pilot program shall be established within the
- 23 <u>Department at a facility or institution built on or after</u>
- 24 January 1, 2002 and designated by the Director in which
- 25 <u>committed persons shall be prohibited from the possession of</u>
- 26 <u>cigarettes and other tobacco products</u>. The Director may
- 27 prohibit the possession of cigarettes and other tobacco
- 28 <u>products by committed persons at institutions and facilities</u>
- of the Department built before January 1, 2002 as the
- 30 <u>Director deems appropriate.</u>
