(a) A person is eligible to be licensed as a midwife if 3 that person meets the following qualifications: 4 5 (1) has no less than a high school diploma or its б equivalent; 7 (2) has completed an approved program of midwifery education; 8 (3) holds the credential of Certified Professional 9 Midwife; 10 (4) is in good standing with the North American 11 12 Registry of Midwives; 13 (5) is at least 21 years of age; (6) participates in peer review at least twice per 14 year; and 15 16 (7) provides the Department with an annually updated informed consent document. 17 (b) Prior to July 1, 2003, an individual who meets all 18 eligibility requirements in subsection (a) of this Section, 19 20 with the exception of item (2) of subsection (a) of this 21 Section, shall be considered eligible to be licensed as a 22 midwife.".
