- 2 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois,
- 3 represented in the General Assembly:
- 4 Section 5. The Illinois Pension Code is amended by
- 5 changing Sections 16-106, 16-118, 16-150, and 16-152 as
- 6 follows:
- 7 (40 ILCS 5/16-106) (from Ch. 108 1/2, par. 16-106)
- 8 Sec. 16-106. Teacher. "Teacher": The following
- 9 individuals, provided that, for employment prior to July 1,
- 10 1990, they are employed on a full-time basis, or if not
- 11 full-time, on a permanent and continuous basis in a position
- in which services are expected to be rendered for at least
- 13 one school term:
- 14 (1) Any educational, administrative, professional
- or other staff employed in the public common schools
- included within this system in a position requiring
- 17 certification under the law governing the certification
- of teachers;
- 19 (2) Any educational, administrative, professional
- or other staff employed in any facility of the Department
- of Children and Family Services or the Department of
- Human Services, in a position requiring certification

- System on May 31, 1987, and (iii) did not elect to become

- 29 (3) Any regional superintendent of schools,

- 31 Superintendent of Education; any person employed by the

State Board of Education as an executive; any executive of the boards engaged in the service of public common school education in school districts covered under this system of which the State Superintendent of Education is an ex-officio member;

- (4) Any employee of a school board association operating in compliance with Article 23 of the School Code who is certificated under the law governing the certification of teachers;
- (5) Any person employed by the retirement system as an executive, and any person employed by the retirement system who is certificated under the law governing the certification of teachers;
- (6) Any educational, administrative, professional or other staff employed by and under the supervision and control of a regional superintendent of schools, provided such employment position requires the person to be certificated under the law governing the certification of teachers and is in an educational program serving 2 or more districts in accordance with a joint agreement authorized by the School Code or by federal legislation;
- (7) Any educational, administrative, professional or other staff employed in an educational program serving 2 or more school districts in accordance with a joint agreement authorized by the School Code or by federal legislation and in a position requiring certification under the laws governing the certification of teachers;
- (8) Any officer or employee of a statewide teacher organization or officer of a national teacher organization who is certified under the law governing certification of teachers, provided: (i) the individual had previously established creditable service under this Article, (ii) the individual files with the system an

irrevocable election to become a member, and (iii) the individual does not receive credit for such service under any other Article of this Code;

(9) Any educational, administrative, professional, or other staff employed in a charter school operating in compliance with the Charter Schools Law who is certificated under the law governing the certification of teachers.

9 An annuitant receiving a retirement annuity under this Article or under Article 17 of this Code who is temporarily 10 11 employed by a board of education or other employer as net exceeding-that permitted under Section 16-118 is not a 12 for purposes of this Article. A person who has 13 "teacher" received a single-sum retirement benefit under 14 Section 15 16-136.4 of this Article is not a "teacher" for purposes of 16 this Article.

- Sec. 16-118. Retirement. "Retirement": Entry upon a retirement annuity or receipt of a single-sum retirement benefit granted under this Article after termination of active service as a teacher.

24 An annuitant receiving a retirement annuity other than a disability retirement annuity may accept employment as a 25 teacher from a school board or other employer specified in 26 Section 16-106 without impairing retirement status if that 2.7 28 employment $(i) \div -(1)$ is not within the school year during 29 which service was terminated; and (ii) (2) does not exceed 100 paid days or 500 paid hours in any school year. 30 31 such permitted employment is partly on a daily and partly on an hourly basis, a day shall be considered as 5 hours. 32 <u>The</u> 33 employment may exceed the period permitted in clause (ii) of

- Sec. 16-150. Re-entry. If an annuitant under this System 19 20 is again employed as a teacher (not including employment for 21 an-aggregate--period--exceeding--that permitted by Section 22 16-118), his or her retirement annuity shall be terminated and the annuitant shall thereupon be regarded as an active 23 24 member. The annuitant's remaining accumulated contributions shall be transferred to the Members' Contribution Reserve 25 from the Employer's Contribution Reserve. 26
- Such annuitant is not entitled to a recomputation of his or her retirement annuity unless at least one full year of creditable service is rendered after the latest re-entry into service and the annuitant must have rendered at least 3 years of creditable service after last re-entry into service to qualify for a recomputation of the retirement annuity based on amendments enacted while in receipt of a retirement

- 1 annuity, except when retirement was due to disability.
- 2 However, regardless of age, an annuitant in receipt of a

- 21 (a) For the purpose of employing retired teachers in
- 22 accordance with Section 16-118 of the Illinois Pension Code,
- 23 <u>the State Board of Education shall notify all school</u>
- 24 <u>districts of (i) any school district or subject area in which</u>
- 25 <u>the State Board of Education finds that there is a shortage</u>
- of teachers and (ii) a finding that there is no longer a
- 27 <u>shortage of teachers in a school district or subject area.</u>
- 28 <u>(b) The State Board of Education shall adopt rules</u>
- 29 <u>concerning the employment terms of retired teachers.</u>
- 30 (c) On or before December 31, 2005, the State Board of
- 31 <u>Education shall submit a report to the Governor and the</u>
- 32 General Assembly, in accordance with Section 3.1 of the

- 1 General Assembly Organization Act, on the impact of this
- 2 amendatory Act of the 92nd General Assembly on teacher
- 3 recruitment and teacher shortages at public schools in this
