- 2 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois,

- 4 Section 5. The Illinois Vehicle Code is amended by
- 5 adding Section 11-212 as follows:
- 6 (625 ILCS 5/11-212 new)
- 7 <u>Sec. 11-212. Traffic stop statistical study.</u>
- 8 (a) From June 1, 2001 until 4 years after the effective
- 9 date of this amendatory Act of the 92nd General Assembly,
- 10 <u>whenever a law enforcement officer of this State or a unit of</u>
- 11 local government issues a uniform traffic citation or warning
- 12 <u>citation for an alleged violation of the Illinois Vehicle</u>
- 13 <u>Code or a similar provision of a local ordinance, he or she</u>
- 14 shall record on the face of the citation in addition to other
- 15 <u>information the following:</u>
- 16 <u>(1) the race of the motorist; and</u>
- 17 (2) whether there was a search of the vehicle,
- 18 <u>vehicle driver, or passenger resulting in no further</u>

- 20 (b) From June 8, 2002 until 3 years after the effective
- 21 <u>date of this amendatory Act of the 92nd General Assembly, the</u>
- 22 <u>Director of State Police and each police chief and county</u>
