1 AN ACT concerning schools.

2 WHEREAS, an estimated 5.3 million American children have 3 asthma; and

WHEREAS, Asthma is the leading serious chronic illness
among children and annually incurs a cost of \$ 3.2 billion in
treating this young population; and

7 WHEREAS, Asthma accounts for 10 million lost school days
8 each year in the United States and is the leading cause of
9 school absenteeism attributed to chronic conditions; and

10 WHEREAS, Asthma is the third-ranking cause of 11 hospitalization among children under the age of 15 years and 12 accounts for almost one in 6 of all pediatric emergency room 13 visits; and

14 WHEREAS, There are more than 5,400 deaths from asthma in 15 this country each year; and

16 WHEREAS, Known asthma triggers range from viral 17 infections to allergies to irritating gases and particles in 18 the air; and

19 WHEREAS, An estimated 200,000 U.S. children with asthma 20 have their condition worsened by exposure to second-hand 21 smoke; and

22 WHEREAS, Resulting asthma attacks in children can be 23 severe; the child may become breathless and have difficulty 24 talking; and

25 WHEREAS, Children with asthma are taught by their

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1 physician or other State-licensed health care provider to 2 take medication to prevent an attack or to help them if an 3 attack occurs; and

4 WHEREAS, A child's asthma can be managed by both 5 treatment and medication; and

6 WHEREAS, Elementary and secondary school students with 7 asthma should have unobstructed access to their asthma 8 medication; therefore

9 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois,10 represented in the General Assembly:

Section 5. The School Code is amended by adding Sections 12 10-20.35 and 34-18.22 as follows:

13 (105 ILCS 5/10-20.35 new)

14 <u>Sec. 10-20.35. Self-administration of asthma medication.</u> 15 (a) In this Section:

"Medication" means a medicine, prescribed by (i) a 16 17 physician licensed to practice medicine in all its branches, (ii) a physician assistant who has been delegated the 18 authority to prescribe asthma medications by his or her 19 supervising physician, or (iii) an advanced practice 20 registered nurse who has a written collaborative agreement 21 with a collaborating physician that delegates the authority 22 to prescribe asthma medications, for a pupil that pertains to 23 the pupil's asthma and that has an individual prescription 24 25 <u>label.</u>

26 <u>"Self-administration" means a pupil's discretionary use</u> 27 <u>of his or her prescribed asthma medication.</u>

28 (b) A school or school board must permit the
 29 self-administration of medication by a pupil with asthma,

| 20 | schools district and its employees and agents are to incur no |
| 21 | liability, except for willful and wanton conduct, as a result |
| 22 | of any injury arising from the self-administration of |
| 23 | medication by the pupil. The parents or guardians of the |

| 25 | district is to incur no liability, except for willful and |
| 26 | wanton conduct, as a result of any injury arising from the |

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1 of the requirements of this Section. 2 (e) Provided that the requirements of this Section are fulfilled, a pupil with asthma may possess and use his or her 3 4 medication (i) while in school, (ii) while at a school-sponsored activity, (iii) while under the supervision 5 of school personnel, or (iv) before or after normal school 6 activities, such as while in before-school or after-school 7 8 care on school-operated property. (105 ILCS 5/34-18.22 new) 9 Sec. 34-18.22. Self-administration of asthma medication. (a) In this Section: "Medication" means a medicine, prescribed by (i) a 12

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physician licensed to practice medicine in all its branches, 13 (ii) a physician assistant who has been delegated the 14 authority to prescribe asthma medications by his or her 15 supervising physician, or (iii) an advanced practice 16 registered nurse who has a written collaborative agreement 17 with a collaborating physician that delegates the authority 18 to prescribe asthma medications, for a pupil that pertains to 19 20 the pupil's asthma and that has an individual prescription 21 <u>label.</u>

(b) The school or school board must permit the 24 self-administration of medication by a pupil with asthma, 25 provided that: 26

(1) the parents or guardians of the pupil provide 27 to the school or board written authorization for the 28 self-administration of medication; and 29

(2) the parents or quardians of the pupil provide 30 to the school or school board a written statement from 31 the pupil's physician, physician assistant, or advanced 32 practice registered nurse containing the following 33

| 33 | activities, such as while in before-school and after-school |
| 34 | care on school-operated property. |
