1 AN ACT in relation to home modifications for older

- 2 persons and persons with disabilities.
- 3 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois,
- 4 represented in the General Assembly:
- 5 Section 1. Short title. This Act may be cited as the
- 6 Home Modification for Prevention of Institutionalization Act.
- Section 5. Findings. The General Assembly finds that it 7 8 is far preferable for older persons and adults and children with disabilities to live in their own homes or in the homes 9 of family members in their own communities rather than in 10 more restrictive institutionalized settings removed from 11 12 their friends and loved ones. The General Assembly further 13 finds that older persons and adults and children with disabilities often are unnecessarily placed or forced to 14 lack of 15 remain in institutionalized settings due to the 16 resources needed to make modifications to their dwellings to enable them to remain in or return to their homes and 17 18 communities. The General Assembly further finds that it is in 19 the best interests of the State of Illinois to support 20 community-based living for older persons and adults and children with disabilities by implementing a program to 21 22 enable them to make modifications to their dwellings to avoid unnecessary placement outside of their own homes 23 and communities. 24
- Section 10. Purpose. The purpose of this Act is to authorize the Department of Human Services and the Department on Aging to jointly establish a program to provide funding for necessary home modifications and assistive technology to enable older persons and adults and children with disabilities to remain in or return to their homes in order

- 1 to allow them to live as independently as possible for as
- 2 long as possible.
- 3 Section 15. Program. Subject to appropriation for these 4 purposes, the Department of Human Services and the Department
- 5 on Aging shall jointly establish a Home Modification Grant
- 6 and Loan Program. The Program shall have 2 components. One
- 7 component shall be administered by the Department of Human
- 8 Services and the other component shall be administered by the
- 9 Department on Aging. The Department of Human Services and
- 10 the Department on Aging shall cooperate in the overall
- 11 administration of the Program.
- 12 Section 20. Eligibility. Persons age 60 or over adults and children with disabilities shall be eligible for 13 14 grants or loans or both under the Home Modification Grant and Loan Program if they have verifiable functional limitations 15 16 for which some modification of their dwelling is required and 17 they are unable to afford, because of limited resources, the cost of the modification. Preference shall be given to 18 imminent 19 applicants who: (1) are at risk of 20 institutionalization or who are already in an institutional 21 setting but are ready to return home and who would be able to live at home if a modification or modifications are made, (2) 22 23 have inadequate resources or no current access to resources as a result of the geographic location of their dwelling, the 24 lack of other available State or federal funds 25 such Community Development Block Grant, rural housing assistance 26 27 programs or income limitations such as the inability to 28 qualify for a low-interest loan, or (3) have access to other resources, but those resources are inadequate to complete the 29 30 necessary modifications. Adults under 60 years of age with disabilities and children with disabilities shall receive 31 services under the component of the Program administered by 32

1 the Department of Human Services. An adult 60 years of 2 or older may elect to receive services under the component administered by the Department of Human Services if, at the 3 4 or she reached age 60, he or she was already he receiving home services under subsection (f) of Section 3 of 5 6 the Disabled Persons Rehabilitation Act and he or she was 7 already receiving services under the component of the Program 8 administered by the Department of Human Services. 9 adults 60 years of age or older receiving services under the 10 Program shall receive services under the component 11 administered by the Department on Aging.

Section 25. Rulemaking. The Department of Human Services and the Department on Aging shall jointly promulgate administrative rules governing the Home Modification Grant and Loan Program consistent with this Act.

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Section 30. Advisory Committee. The Department of Human Services and the Department on Aging shall jointly establish an Advisory Committee for the Home Modification Grant and Loan Program to advise the Secretary of Human Services and the Director on Aging on policies and procedures under which the Program shall operate. The Advisory Committee shall consist of no fewer than 9 nor more than 15 members and shall include at least one individual with a disability, one individual over the age of 60, the Secretary of Human Services or his or her designee, the Director of Aging or his or her designee, a representative of an Area Agency on Aging, the Executive Director of the Statewide Independent Living Council or his or her designee, a representative from the construction industry who specializes in home modifications for individuals with disabilities and older persons, the Executive Director of the Illinois Assistive Technology Project or his or her designee, and the Executive Director of

- 1 the Coalition of Citizens with Disabilities in Illinois or
- 2 his or her designee.
- 3 Section 99. Effective date. This Act takes effect upon
- 4 becoming law.
