AN ACT concerning transitional bilingual education
 teaching certificates.

3 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois,4 represented in the General Assembly:

5 Section 5. The School Code is amended by changing
6 Sections 14C-8 and 21-2 as follows:

7 (105 ILCS 5/14C-8) (from Ch. 122, par. 14C-8)

8 Sec. 14C-8. Teacher certification - Qualifications -Issuance of certificates. No person shall be eligible for 9 employment by a school district as a teacher of transitional 10 bilingual education without either (a) holding a valid 11 teaching certificate issued pursuant to Article 21 of this 12 13 Code and meeting such additional language and course requirements as prescribed by the State Board of Education, 14 15 in consultation with the State Teacher Certification Board, 16 or (b) meeting the requirements set forth in this Section. The <u>State Board of Education, in consultation with the State</u> 17 Teacher Certification Board, shall issue certificates valid 18 19 for teaching in all grades of the common school in transitional bilingual education programs to any person who 20 presents it with satisfactory evidence that he possesses an 21 22 adequate speaking and reading ability in a language other than English in which transitional bilingual education is 23 offered and communicative skills in English, and possessed 24 25 within 5 years previous to his or her applying for a certificate under this Section a valid teaching certificate 26 27 issued by a foreign country, or by a State or possession or territory of the United States, or other evidence of teaching 28 29 preparation as may be determined to be sufficient by the State Board of Education, in consultation with the State 30 31 Teacher Certification Board, or holds a degree from an

institution of higher learning in a foreign country which the State Board of Education, in consultation with the State Certification Board, determines to be the equivalent of a bachelor's degree from a recognized institution of higher learning in the United States; provided that any person seeking a certificate under this Section must meet the following additional requirements:

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(1) Such persons must be in good health;

(2) Such persons must be of sound moral character;

10 (3) Such persons must be legally present in the United11 States and possess legal authorization for employment;

12 (4) Such persons must not be employed to replace any 13 presently employed teacher who otherwise would not be 14 replaced for any reason.

15 Certificates issued issuable pursuant to this Section 16 shall be <u>called transitional bilingual certificates</u>. These 17 certificates are valid for 2 years and may not be renewed more than 3 times for a period of 2 years each, after the 18 2nd, 4th, and 6th year of teaching. A transitional bilingual 19 20 certificate may not be renewed unless the holder successfully 21 completes a minimum of 9 semester hours of college or 22 university coursework in an approved education program 23 leading to eligibility for an Initial or Standard Teaching Certificate, issued pursuant to Section 21-2 of this Code, 24 25 during each 2-year validity period of the transitional bilingual certificate. All applications for renewal of a 26 transitional bilingual certificate shall be directed to the 27 State Board of Education and shall contain documentation that 28 the certificate holder has successfully completed the 29 required coursework. issuable--only--during--the--5--years 30 immediately-following-the-effective--date--of--this--Act--and 31 32 thereafter--for--additional--periods--of-one-year-only-upon-a 33 determination-by-the-State-Board-of-Education-that--a--school 34 district--lacks--the--number--of-teachers-necessary-to-comply

15 Each holder of a transitional bilingual certificate must develop a plan for satisfying the renewal requirements every 16 17 2 years, if necessary, and must maintain records of completion of required coursework to document his or her 18 progress. Each school district that employs a holder of a 19 transitional bilingual certificate must (i) review the 20 certificate holder's plan, (ii) monitor the certificate 21 22 holder's progress made annually, and (iii) retain the documentation provided by the certificate holder. The school 23 24 district must certify to the State Board of Education that the certificate holder has successfully completed the 25 required coursework. If exceptional circumstances exist, the 26 State Superintendent of Education may grant an additional 27 period of time to fulfill the renewal requirements for one 28 2-year period, as long as the maximum amount of time a 29 certificate is held is 8 years. Eligibility and application 30 31 for the additional period of time shall be determined in accordance with rules established by the State Board of 32 Education, in consultation with the State Teacher 33 Certification Board.  mentoring by an experienced teacher during the first 2 years
 that the holder's certificate is valid.

4 An individual who completes 4 years of teaching after receiving a transitional bilingual certificate issued and 5 renewed pursuant to this Section qualifies for a Standard 6 7 Teaching Certificate, provided that the individual satisfies 8 the requirements for a Standard Certificate established under 9 subsection (c) of Section 21-2 of this Code, including successful completion of the Standard Teaching Certificate 10 Examination beginning July 1, 2003. An individual who so 11 qualifies for a Standard Teaching Certificate without receipt 12 13 of an Initial Teaching Certificate must successfully complete the Initial Teaching Certification examination established 14 under subsection (b) of Section 21-2 of this Code. A 15 transitional bilingual certificate may not be renewed after 16 the 4th year of teaching unless the certificate holder 17 satisfactorily passes the test of basic skills established 18 19 under Section 21-1a of this Code before application for a second renewal. After-the-effective-date-of-this-amendatory 20 21 Act-of-1984,-an-additional-renewal-for--a--period--to--expire 22 August-31,-1985,-may-be-granted.-The-State-Board-of-Education 23 shall-report-to-the-General-Assembly-on-or-before-January-31, 1985-its-recommendations-for-the-qualification-of-teachers-of 24 25 bilingual--education-and-for-the-qualification-of-teachers-of 26 English-as-a--second--language---Said--qualification--program shall-take-effect-no-later-than-August-31,-1985. 27

Beginning July 1, 2001, the State Board of Education shall implement a test or tests to assess the speaking, reading, writing, and grammar skills of applicants for a certificate issued under this Section in the English language and in the language of the transitional bilingual education program requested by the applicant and shall establish appropriate fees for these tests. The State Board of

1 Education, in consultation with the Certification Board, 2 shall promulgate rules to implement the required tests, including specific provisions to govern test selection, test 3 4 validation, determination of a passing score, administration 5 of the test or tests, frequency of administration, applicant 6 fees, identification requirements for test takers, frequency 7 applicants taking the tests, the years for which a score of 8 is valid, waiving tests for individuals who have 9 satisfactorily passed other tests, and the consequences of dishonest conduct in the application for or taking of the 10 11 tests.

If the qualifications of an applicant for a certificate 12 valid for teaching in transitional bilingual 13 education in all grades of the common schools do not meet the 14 programs established for 15 requirements the issuance of that 16 certificate, the Certification Board nevertheless shall issue the applicant a substitute teacher's certificate 17 under 18 Section 21-9 whenever it appears from the face of the 19 application submitted for certification as a teacher of transitional bilingual education and the evidence presented 20 21 in support thereof that the applicant's qualifications meet 22 the requirements established for the issuance of а 23 certificate under Section 21-9; provided, that if it does not appear from the face of such application and supporting 24 25 evidence that the applicant is qualified for issuance of a certificate under Section 21-9 the Certification Board shall 26 evaluate the application with reference to the requirements 27 for issuance of certificates under Section 21-9 and shall 28 29 inform the applicant, at the time it denies the application submitted for certification as a teacher of transitional 30 bilingual education, of the additional qualifications which 31 32 the applicant must possess in order to meet the requirements established for issuance of (i) a certificate valid for 33 34 teaching in transitional bilingual education programs in all

Sec. 21-2. Grades of certificates.

(a) Until February 15, 2000, all certificates issued 6 under this Article shall be State certificates valid, except 7 as limited in Section 21-1, in every school district coming 8 under the provisions of this Act and shall be limited in time 9 as 10 and designated follows: Provisional vocational certificate, temporary provisional vocational certificate, 11 early childhood certificate, elementary school certificate, 12 special certificate, high school certificate, school service 13 14 personnel certificate, administrative certificate, provisional certificate, and substitute certificate. 15 The requirement of student teaching under close and competent 16 17 supervision for obtaining a teaching certificate may be 18 waived by the State Teacher Certification Board upon presentation to the Board by the teacher of evidence of 5 19 20 years successful teaching experience on a valid certificate 21 and graduation from a recognized institution of higher 22 learning with a bachelor's degree with not less than 120 semester hours and a minimum of 16 semester hours in 23 24 professional education.

(b) Initial Teaching Certificate. 25 Beginning February 15, 2000, persons who (1) have completed an approved teacher 26 preparation program, (2) are recommended by an approved 27 28 teacher preparation program, (3) have successfully completed 29 the Initial Teaching Certification examinations required by the State Board of Education, and (4) have met all other 30 31 criteria established by the State Board of Education in consultation with the State Teacher Certification Board, 32 shall be issued an Initial Teaching Certificate valid for 4 33

1 years of teaching, as defined in Section 21-14 of this Code. 2 Initial Teaching Certificates shall be issued for categories corresponding to Early Childhood, Elementary, Secondary, and 3 4 Special K-12, with special certification designations for 5 Special Education, Bilingual Education, fundamental learning 6 (including Language Arts, Reading, Mathematics, areas 7 Science, Social Science, Physical Development and Health, 8 Fine Arts, and Foreign Language), and other areas designated 9 by the State Board of Education, in consultation with the State Teacher Certification Board. 10

11 (c) Standard Certificate. Beginning February 15, 2000, persons who (1) have completed 4 years of teaching, as 12 defined in Section 21-14 of this Code, with an Initial 13 Certificate or an Initial Alternative Teaching Certificate 14 15 and have met all other criteria established by the State 16 Board of Education in consultation with the State Teacher Certification Board, (2) have completed 4 years of teaching 17 on a valid equivalent certificate in another State 18 or 19 territory of the United States, <u>have completed 4 years of</u> 20 teaching on a valid certificate issued pursuant to Section 21 14C-8 of this Code, or have completed 4 years of teaching in 22 a nonpublic Illinois elementary or secondary school with an 23 Initial Certificate or an Initial Alternative Teaching Certificate, and have met all other criteria established by 24 25 the State Board of Education, in consultation with the State Teacher Certification Board, or (3) were issued teaching 26 certificates prior to February 15, 2000 and are renewing 27 those certificates after February 15, 2000, shall be issued a 28 Standard Certificate valid for 5 years, which may be renewed 29 30 thereafter every 5 years by the State Teacher Certification Board based on proof of continuing education or professional 31 32 development. Beginning July 1, 2003, persons who have completed 4 years of teaching, as described in clauses (1) 33 and (2) of this subsection (c), have successfully completed 34

1 the Standard Teaching Certificate Examinations, and have met 2 all other criteria established by the State Board of Education, in consultation with the 3 State Teacher 4 Certification Board, shall be issued Standard Certificates. 5 Standard Certificates shall be issued for categories б corresponding to Early Childhood, Elementary, Secondary, and 7 Special K-12, with special certification designations for 8 Special Education, Bilingual Education, fundamental learning 9 areas (including Language Arts, Reading, Mathematics, Science, Social Science, Physical Development and Health, 10 11 Fine Arts, and Foreign Language), and other areas designated by the State Board of Education, in consultation with the 12 State Teacher Certification Board. 13

(d) Master Certificate. Beginning February 15, 2000, 14 have successfully achieved National Board 15 persons who 16 certification through the National Board for Professional Teaching Standards shall be issued a Master Certificate, 17 valid for 10 years and renewable thereafter every 10 years 18 19 through compliance with requirements set forth by the State Board of Education, in consultation with the State Teacher 20 Certification Board. However, each teacher who holds a Master 21 22 Certificate shall be eligible for a teaching position in this 23 State in the areas for which he or she holds a Master Certificate without satisfying any other requirements of this 24 25 Code, except for those requirements pertaining to criminal background checks. A teacher who holds a Master Certificate 26 shall be deemed to meet State certification 27 renewal requirements in the area or areas for which he or she holds a 28 Master Certificate for the 10-year term of the teacher's 29 30 Master Certificate.
