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AN ACT in relation to animals.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois,represented in the General Assembly:

4 Section 5. The Illinois Dangerous Animals Act is amended 5 by changing Sections 0.1, 1, 2, 3, and 4 and adding Sections 6 1.5 and 5 as follows:

7 (720 ILCS 585/0.1) (from Ch. 8, par. 240)

8 Sec. 0.1. <u>Definitions.</u> As used in this Act, unless the 9 context otherwise requires:

10 "Dangerous animal" means a lion, tiger, leopard, ocelot, 11 jaguar, cheetah, margay, mountain lion, lynx, bobcat, 12 jaguarundi, bear, hyena, wolf or coyote, or any poisonous or 13 life-threatening reptile.

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<u>"Department" means the Department of Agriculture.</u>

"Director" means the Director of Agriculture.

16 "Owner" means any person who (a) has a right of property 17 in a dangerous animal, (b) keeps or harbors a dangerous 18 animal, (c) has a dangerous animal in his care, or (d) acts 19 as custodian of a dangerous animal.

20 "Person" means any individual, firm, association, 21 partnership, corporation, or other legal entity, any public 22 or private institution, the State of Illinois, or any 23 municipal corporation or political subdivision of the State.

24 <u>"Primate" means any non-human mammal, other than a cat or</u>
25 <u>doq.</u>

28 Sec. 1. <u>Harboring of dangerous animals and primates.</u>
29 (a) No person shall have a right of property in, keep,
30 harbor, care for, act as custodian of or maintain in his <u>or</u>

<u>her</u> possession any dangerous animal <u>or primate</u> except at a
 properly maintained zoological park, federally licensed
 exhibit, circus, scientific or educational institution,
 research laboratory, veterinary hospital or animal refuge in
 an escape-proof enclosure.

6 (b) This Section does not apply to a person who has been 7 issued a permit to own or keep a primate by the Department 8 under Section 1.5.

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<u>Sec. 1.5. Permit to keep primates.</u>

12 <u>(a) Except as otherwise provided in this Act, on and</u> 13 after the effective date of this amendatory Act of the 92nd 14 General Assembly, the ownership, keeping, harboring, caring 15 for, acting as custodian of, or maintaining in one's 16 possession a primate is prohibited.

17 (b) The Department may license the ownership and
 18 possession of primates that were:

19 (1) legally within this State at the time of the 20 effective date of this amendatory Act of the 92nd General 21 <u>Assembly; or</u>

22 (2) born within 60 days after the adoption of rules
 23 to enforce this Section.

24 <u>(c) A person who owns a primate as described in</u> 25 <u>subsection (b) may receive a permit from the Department that</u> 26 <u>allows the person to own and possess the primate if each of</u> 27 <u>the following conditions are or will be met:</u>

(1) the person has furnished the Department with
 evidence satisfactory to the Department that the primate
 has been rendered permanently incapable of reproduction;
 (2) a form of permanent identification has been

 33 <u>Department; and</u>

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1 (3) the person follows any other rules adopted by 2 the Department for the enforcement of this Section. 3 (d) The Department may adopt rules: 4 (1) prohibiting the public display of primates outside the private property of the owners who have 5 obtained permits under this Section, except for 6 transportation of the primates for veterinary care or 7 8 transport outside this State; and 9 (2) establishing minimum standards of care, 10 including veterinary care, for primates. 11 (e) A permit must be issued for each primate separately. 12 Each permit authorizes a named individual person to own a permanently identifiable individual primate within this 13 State. A permit is not transferable between persons or 14 15 between primates. 16 (f) The Department may charge an annual permit fee in an 17 amount determined by the Department. The permit fees must be deposited into the Primate Protection Fund that is created as 18 19 a revolving fund outside the State Treasury and under the 20 control of the Director. 21 (g) On and after the adoption of rules to enforce this 22 Section, the Department may levy a civil penalty of \$500 for each primate that is kept, harbored, cared for, or maintained 23 24 in violation this Section. Moneys from the levy of these 25 civil penalties must be deposited into the Primate Protection

Sec. 2. <u>Domestication.</u> It is no defense to a violation of Section 1 that the person violating such Section has attempted to domesticate the dangerous animal. If there appears to be imminent danger to the public, any dangerous animal found not in compliance with the provisions of this Act shall be subject to seizure and may immediately be placed

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1 in an approved facility. Upon the conviction of a person for a violation of Section 1, the animal with regard to which 2 the conviction was obtained shall be confiscated and placed 3 4 in an approved facility, with the owner thereof to be responsible for all costs connected with the seizure and 5 6 confiscation of such animal. Approved facilities include, but 7 limited to, a zoological park, federally licensed are not 8 exhibit, humane society, veterinary hospital or animal 9 refuge.

Sec. 3. <u>Sentence.</u> Any person violating this Act shall be guilty of a Class C misdemeanor. Each day of violation constitutes a separate offense.

In the event the person violating this Act is a corporation or partnership, any officer, director, manager or managerial agent of the partnership or corporation who violates this Section or causes the partnership or corporation to violate this Section is guilty of a Class C misdemeanor.
