- 2 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois,
- 3 represented in the General Assembly:
- 4 Section 5. The Lead Poisoning Prevention Act is amended
- 5 by adding Sections 6.3 and 14.5 as follows:
- 6 (410 ILCS 45/6.3 new)
- 7 <u>Sec. 6.3. Physicians to screen pregnant women.</u>
- 8 (a) If a physician licensed to practice medicine in all
- 9 <u>its branches has occasion to examine or treat a pregnant</u>
- 10 woman, the physician shall determine whether the woman has
- 11 been screened for lead poisoning. Except as provided in
- 12 <u>subsection (c), if the woman has not been screened for lead</u>
- 13 poisoning, the physician shall ensure that the woman
- 14 <u>undergoes a lead blood level screening.</u>
- 15 (b) If a woman screens positive for lead poisoning under
- this Section, the physician shall warn the woman, orally and
- 17 <u>in writing, of the dangers of breast feeding</u> her infant
- while she has lead poisoning.
- 19 <u>(c) Nothing in this Section shall be construed to</u>
- 20 <u>require a woman to undergo a lead blood level screening if</u>
- 21 the woman objects on the grounds that the screening conflicts

- 24 <u>Sec. 14.5. Reports to General Assembly. The Department</u>
- 25 <u>shall submit quarterly reports to the General Assembly</u>
- 26 <u>concerning the implementation of measures under this Act to</u>
- 27 prevent and treat lead poisoning. The Department shall file
- 28 <u>its first report by November 1, 2001 and shall file its</u>
- 29 <u>subsequent reports within 30 days after the end of each</u>
- 30 <u>calendar quarter</u>.
