- 4 Section 5. The School Code is amended by changing
- 5 Section 21-9 as follows:
- 6 (105 ILCS 5/21-9) (from Ch. 122, par. 21-9)
- 7 Sec. 21-9. Substitute certificates and substitute
- 8 teaching.
- (a) A substitute teacher's certificate may be issued for 9 teaching in all grades of the common schools. 10 Such certificate may be issued upon request of the regional 11 superintendent of schools of any region in which the teacher 12 13 is to teach. A substitute teacher's certificate is valid for teaching in the public schools of any county. 14 15 certificate may be issued to persons who either (a) hold a 16 certificate valid for teaching in the common schools as shown on the face of the certificate, (b) hold a bachelor of 17 18 arts degree from an institution of higher learning accredited by the North Central Association or other comparable regional 19 20 accrediting association or have been graduated from recognized institution of higher learning with a bachelor's 21 22 degree, or (c) have had 2 years of teaching experience and meet such other rules and regulations as may be adopted by 23 the State Board of Education in consultation with the State 24 Teacher Certification Board. Such certificate shall expire 25 on June 30 in the fourth year from date of issue. Substitute 26 27 teacher's certificates are not subject to endorsement as described in Section 21-1b of this Code. 28
- 29 (b) A teacher holding a substitute teacher's certificate
 30 may teach only in the place of a certified teacher who is
 31 under contract with the employing board and may teach only

1 when no appropriate fully certified teacher is available to 2 teach in a substitute capacity. A teacher holding an early childhood certificate, an elementary certificate, a high 3 4 school certificate, or a special certificate may 5 substitute teach in grades K-12 but only in the place of a 6 certified teacher who is under contract with the employing A substitute teacher may teach for an unlimited 7 8 number of days in a school district, provided that if the 9 substitute teacher teaches for a period exceeding 90 paid school days or 450 paid school hours in the district in a 10 11 school term for 4 consecutive years, he or she must hold a certificate issued under Section 21-2 of this Code to 12 continue to substitute teach. A-substitute-teacher-may-teach 13 only-for-a-period-not-to-exceed-90-paid-school--days--or--450 14 15 paid--school--hours--in--any--one--school-district-in-any-one 16 school-term. Where such teaching is partly on a daily and partly on an hourly basis, a school day shall be considered 17 18 as 5 hours. The teaching limitations imposed by 19 subsection upon teachers holding substitute certificates shall not apply in any school district operating under 20 Article 34. 21
