- 3 the title with the following:
- 4 "AN ACT in relation to mental health."; and
- 5 by replacing everything after the enacting clause with the

- 7 "Section 5. The Community Mental Health Act is amended
- 8 by adding Sections 8.100, 8.102, 8.105, 8.110, 8.115, 8.120,
- 9 8.125, 8.130, 8.135, 8.140, 8.145, 8.150, 8.155, 8.160,
- 10 8.165, 8.170, and 8.175 as follows:
- 11 (405 ILCS 20/8.100 new)
- 12 <u>Sec. 8.100. Purpose. It is the purpose of this Act to</u>
- 13 prevent or avoid institutionalization of individuals with
- 14 mental illness or a co-occurring disorder of mental illness
- 15 <u>and substance abuse. The Department of Human Services shall</u>
- 16 <u>implement</u>, <u>coordinate</u>, <u>monitor</u>, <u>and evaluate the CHOICES</u>
- 17 program, as described in this Section and the following
- 18 <u>Sections preceding Section 9, in cooperation with all</u>
- 19 governmental and private resources, organizations, and
- 20 <u>stakeholders</u>. <u>Programs shall address the needs of qualified</u>
- 21 <u>individuals</u>, both children and adults. The CHOICES program

- 1 will provide cost effective, community residential
- 2 <u>environments and supports to enable individuals with a mental</u>
- 3 <u>illness or a mental illness and substance abuse co-occurring</u>
- 4 <u>disorder to live successfully in the community.</u>
- 5 (405 ILCS 20/8.102 new)
- 6 Sec. 8.102. Definitions. In Section 8.100 and the
- 7 <u>subsequent Sections preceding Section 9 of this Act:</u>
- 8 "Individual with a disability" means any of the
- 9 <u>following:</u>
- 10 <u>(1) An individual, whether a child or an adult, who</u>
- 11 <u>has a physical or mental impairment that substantially</u>
- 12 <u>limits one or more of the individual's major life</u>
- 13 <u>activities.</u>
- 14 (2) An individual, whether a child or an adult, who
- 15 <u>has a record of a physical or mental impairment that</u>
- 16 <u>substantially limited one or more of the individual's</u>
- 17 <u>major life activities.</u>
- 18 <u>(3) An individual, whether a child or an adult, who</u>
- is regarded as having a physical or mental impairment,
- 20 <u>whether the individual has the impairment or not.</u>
- 21 <u>"Mental impairment" means a mental or psychological</u>
- 22 <u>disorder or emotional or mental illness.</u>
- 23 "Physical impairment" means drug addiction or alcoholism,
- 24 or both.
- 25 <u>"Stakeholder" means an advocacy organization or service</u>
- 26 provider whose mission includes advocacy for or provision of
- 27 <u>quality services to individuals with a disability of mental</u>
- 28 <u>illness or a co-occurring disorder of mental illness and</u>
- 29 <u>substance abuse.</u>
- 30 (405 ILCS 20/8.105 new)
- 31 <u>Sec. 8.105. Implementation of program. The Department of</u>
- 32 <u>Human Services is directed to implement the CHOICES program.</u>

- 1 The Department of Public Aid, the Department on Aging, the
- 2 <u>Department of Children and Family Services, the Department of</u>
- 3 <u>Public Health, the Bureau of the Budget, and other State</u>
- 4 agencies as appropriate shall cooperate fully with the
- 5 <u>Department of Human Services in fulfilling the requirements</u>
- 6 of Section 8.100 and the subsequent Sections preceding
- 7 <u>Section 9.</u>
- 8 (405 ILCS 20/8.110 new)
- 9 <u>Sec. 8.110. Community services. In order to prevent or</u>
- 10 <u>avoid institutionalization of individuals with a disability,</u>
- 11 <u>the Department of Human Services shall implement, coordinate,</u>
- 12 monitor, and evaluate community services for individuals with
- disabilities in Illinois in cooperation with all governmental
- 14 and private resources, organizations, and stakeholders.
- 15 Programs shall address the needs of qualified individuals,
- 16 both children and adults, with disabilities, in the following
- 17 <u>disability areas:</u>
- 18 <u>(1) Mental illness.</u>
- (2) <u>Mental illness and substance abuse.</u>
- 20 (405 ILCS 20/8.115 new)
- 21 <u>Sec. 8.115. Implementation; program components.</u>
- 22 (a) Subject to appropriations, the Department of Human
- 23 <u>Services shall implement the CHOICES program for individuals</u>
- 24 <u>with a mental illness or co-occurring disability of mental</u>
- 25 <u>illness and substance abuse</u>. <u>The CHOICES program shall</u>
- 26 consist of a program for 1,000 individuals with a disability,
- 27 <u>designed to provide a system of services and supports for</u>
- 28 <u>those qualified individuals with a disability to live in the</u>
- 29 <u>most integrated community-based integrated setting</u>. The
- 30 <u>Department shall begin implementation of the program by</u>
- 31 January 1, 2002, and shall implement the program statewide
- 32 <u>within 4 years after the effective date of this amendatory</u>

- 1 Act of the 92nd General Assembly. The Department shall
- 2 adopt rules for the selection of the initial program
- 3 participants.
- 4 (b) From existing funds and funds appropriated by the
- 5 General Assembly, the Department of Human Services shall do
- 6 <u>the following:</u>
- 7 (1) Develop a comprehensive plan to develop and
- 8 <u>maintain a statewide system of community-based services</u>
- 9 that reflect the choices and needs of individuals with
- 10 <u>mental illness or a co-occurring disorder of mental</u>
- 11 <u>illness and substance abuse and their families in</u>
- 12 <u>Illinois</u>, to <u>prevent</u> or <u>avoid unnecessary</u>
- 13 <u>institutionalization</u>.
- 14 (2) Carry out all functions and duties required by
- 15 <u>law through collaboration with individuals with mental</u>
- 16 <u>illness or a co-occurring disorder of mental illness and</u>
- 17 <u>substance abuse, their families and guardians, community</u>
- organizations, and providers throughout the State.
- 19 <u>(3) Facilitate or provide technical assistance to</u>
- 20 <u>community service providers in planning, developing, and</u>
- 21 <u>implementing services and supports for individuals with</u>
- 22 <u>mental illness or a co-occurring disorder of mental</u>
- illness and substance abuse and their families.
- 24 (4) Consider the needs in the field of mental
- 25 <u>illness or mental illness and substance abuse and make</u>
- 26 <u>recommendations to the General Assembly and the Governor</u>
- for changes in the law. From funds appropriated by the
- 28 <u>General Assembly to the Department of Human Services for</u>
- 29 <u>that purpose, the Secretary of the Department of Human</u>
- 30 <u>Services shall establish initiatives including, but not</u>
- 31 <u>limited to, the CHOICES program as described in Section</u>

3	(c) The CHOICES program's components shall include the
4	following:
5	(1) Policies to avoid inappropriate placement of an
6	individual in an institution, including general acute
7	care hospitals, hospitals with distinct parts for
8	psychiatric care, freestanding public or private
9	psychiatric hospitals, residential treatment facilities,
10	and nursing facilities.
11	(2) Institutional pre-admission screening and
12	mandated follow up.
13	(3) A cost-benefit analysis concerning placement of
14	the person in the community.
15	(405 ILCS 20/8.120 new)
16	Sec. 8.120. CHOICES program features. The CHOICES
17	program shall include the following features:
18	(1) It shall require 1,000 additional
19	community-based integrated residential settings with
20	appropriate community supports.
21	(2) It shall create programs to train institutional
22	discharge staff treating individuals with disabilities
23	training on community-based alternatives.
24	(3) It shall require a process to inform a person
25	of all available options for his or her care before that
26	person makes a decision on his or her placement.
27	(4) It shall offer, before placement, the
28	assistance of a planning specialist who will assist the
29	person in making the move from an institution to a
30	community setting.
31	(5) It shall fund outreach activities to identify
32	persons in institutions who may wish to move. The
33	Department of Human Services shall establish the

- 1 qualifications of persons and or organizations who
- 2 <u>perform the outreach for community-based organizations</u>
- 3 <u>funded through the program. The guardian of the person,</u>
- 4 <u>if any, must be involved with the outreach process and</u>
- 5 <u>the resident.</u>
- 6 (405 ILCS 20/8.125 new)
- 7 Sec. 8.125. Provision of services. In accordance with an
- 8 <u>individual program plan or an individual treatment plan, or</u>
- 9 both, based on a comprehensive evaluation, individuals with a
- 10 <u>disability may be provided the services described in the</u>
- 11 <u>Sections following this Section.</u>
- 12 (405 ILCS 20/8.130 new)
- 13 <u>Sec. 8.130. Comprehensive evaluation and diagnosis. An</u>
- 14 <u>individual</u> with a disability who is applying for services is
- 15 <u>entitled to receive a comprehensive evaluation and diagnosis,</u>
- 16 <u>including an assessment of skills, abilities, and potential</u>
- 17 for residential and work placement, adapted to his or her
- 18 primary language, cultural background, and ethnic origin.
- 19 All components of a comprehensive evaluation must be
- 20 <u>administered by a qualified examiner.</u>
- 21 (405 ILCS 20/8.135 new)
- 22 <u>Sec. 8.135. Individual program plan. An individual with a</u>
- 23 <u>disability is entitled to receive services in accordance with</u>
- 24 <u>a current individual program plan or an individual treatment</u>
- 25 plan, or both. An individual with a disability who is
- 26 <u>receiving services shall be provided periodic reevaluation</u>
- 27 <u>and review of the individual program plan or individual</u>
- 28 <u>treatment plan, or both, at least twice each year, in order</u>
- 29 <u>to measure progress, to modify or change objectives if</u>
- 30 <u>necessary</u>, and to provide guidance and remediation
- 31 <u>techniques</u>. An individual with a disability and his or her

- 1 representatives have the right (i) to participate in the
- 2 planning and decision-making process regarding the
- 3 <u>individual's program plan and (ii) to be informed in writing,</u>
- 4 <u>or in that individual's mode of communication, of progress at</u>
- 5 <u>reasonable time intervals. Each individual must be given he</u>
- 6 opportunity to make decisions and exercise options regarding
- 7 the plan, consistent with the individual's capabilities.
- 8 (405 ILCS 20/8.140 new)
- 9 <u>Sec. 8.140. Nondiscriminatory access to services. An</u>
- 10 <u>individual with a disability may not be denied program</u>
- 11 <u>services because of age, sex, ethnic origin, marital status,</u>
- 12 <u>ability to pay (except when contrary to law), criminal</u>
- 13 record, degree of disability, or illness.
- 14 (405 ILCS 20/8.145 new)
- 15 <u>Sec. 8.145. Family or individual support. An individual</u>
- 16 <u>with a disability must be provided family or individual</u>
- 17 <u>support services</u>, or both, to prevent unnecessary out-of-home
- 18 placement and to foster independent living skills.
- 19 (405 ILCS 20/8.150 new)
- 20 Sec. 8.150. Residential choices and options. An
- 21 <u>individual</u> with a disability who requires residential
- 22 placement in a supervised or supported setting must be
- 23 provided choices among various residential options. The
- 24 placement must be offered in the most integrated community
- 25 <u>setting possible.</u>
- 26 (405 ILCS 20/8.155 new)
- 27 <u>Sec. 8.155. Vocational training. An individual with a</u>
- 28 <u>disability must be provided vocational training, when</u>
- 29 <u>appropriate</u>, that contributes to the individual's
- 30 <u>independence</u> and employment potential. This training must

- 1 <u>include strategies and activities in programs that lead to</u>
- 2 <u>employment and reemployment.</u>
- 3 (405 ILCS 20/8.160 new)
- 4 Sec. 8.160. Employment. An individual with a disability
- 5 <u>has the right to be employed free from discrimination</u>,
- 6 pursuant to the Constitution and laws of this State.
- 7 (405 ILCS 20/8.165 new)
- 8 <u>Sec. 8.165. Case coordination services. An individual</u>
- 9 <u>with a disability must be provided case coordination</u>
- 10 <u>services</u>, as appropriate.
- 11 (405 ILCS 20/8.170 new)
- 12 <u>Sec. 8.170. Due process; judicial review.</u>
- 13 (a) An individual with a disability retains the rights
- of citizenship. Any individual aggrieved by a decision of a
- 15 <u>department of State government regarding services provided</u>
- 16 <u>under this Act must be given an opportunity to present</u>
- 17 <u>complaints at a due process hearing before a hearing officer</u>
- designated by the director of that department.
- (b) Any individual aggrieved by a final administrative
- 20 <u>decision</u> rendered following the due-process hearing may seek
- 21 judicial review of that decision pursuant to the
- 22 <u>Administrative Review Law. The term "administrative decision"</u>
- 23 <u>is defined as in Section 3-101 of the Code of Civil</u>
- 24 Procedure. Reasonable attorney's fees and costs may be
- 25 <u>awarded to the successful plaintiff in any formal</u>
- 26 <u>administrative or judicial action under this Act.</u>
- 27 (c) The right to a hearing under this Section is in
- 28 <u>addition to any other rights under federal, State, or local</u>
- 29 laws.
- 30 (405 ILCS 20/8.175 new)

- Sec. 8.175. Transitional living assistance. The 1 Department of Human Services shall lead a coordinated effort 2 3 with the Department of Commerce and Community Affairs to 4 further develop housing assistance programs to promote the 5 ability of individuals to move from institutions to the most integrated community residence. The program shall address б 7 eligibility criteria, the period a person may receive assistance, the types of housing expenses to be covered, and 8 9 the locations of the programs. The Department of Human 10 Services shall administer the program and may seek the advice of the Department of Commerce and Community Affairs for this 11 12 purpose.
- 13 Section 99. Effective date. This Act takes effect upon becoming law.".
