- 8 <u>under this Act must have a written policy to address the use</u>
- 9 of restraints and seclusion in the hospital. The Department

- 30 Section 10. The Nursing and Advanced Practice Nursing

- 3 Sec. 5-10. Definitions. Each of the following terms,
- 4 when used in this Act, shall have the meaning ascribed to it
- 5 in this Section, except where the context clearly indicates

- 7 (a) "Department" means the Department of Professional

- 9 (b) "Director" means the Director of Professional

- this Act is entitled to use the titles "registered nurse" and 15
- 16 "registered professional nurse" and the abbreviation, "R.N.".
- (1) "Registered professional nursing practice" includes 17
- all nursing specialities and means the performance of any 18
- nursing act based upon professional knowledge, judgment, and 19
- skills acquired by means of completion of an approved 20

- registered professional nurse provides nursing whole

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- interdependence of its parts through the nursing process to 24

The foregoing shall not be deemed to include those acts of medical diagnosis or prescription of 12 13 therapeutic or corrective measures that are properly performed only by physicians licensed in the State of 14 15 Illinois.
- 16 (m) "Current nursing practice update course" means 17 nursing education curriculum approved by the 18 Department consisting of activities that have educational 19 objectives, instructional methods, content or subject matter, clinical practice, and evaluation methods, related to basic 20 review and updating content and specifically planned for 21 those nurses previously licensed in the United States or its 22 23 territories and preparing for reentry into nursing practice.
- (n) "Professional assistance program for nurses" means a 24 25 professional assistance program that meets criteria established by the Board of Nursing and approved by the 26 which provides a non-disciplinary treatment 27 Director, approach for nurses licensed under this Act whose ability to 28 practice is compromised by alcohol or chemical substance 29 30 addiction.
