Compensation. (a) The county board shall provide the compensation of 8 Clerks of the Circuit Court, and the amount necessary for 9 clerk hire, stationery, fuel and other expenses. Beginning 10 December 1, 1989, the compensation per annum for Clerks of 11 12 the Circuit Court shall be as follows: In counties where the population is: 13 14 Less than 14,000..... at least \$13,500 15 14,001-30,000.... at least \$14,500 30,001-60,000.... 16 at least \$15,000 60,001-100,000.... at least \$15,000 17 100,001-200,000.... 18 at least \$16,500 19 200,001-300,000.... at least \$18,000 300,001- 3,000,000..... 20 at least \$20,000 Over 3,000,000.... at least \$55,000 21 22 (b) In counties in which the population is 3,000,000 or

1 less, "base salary" is the compensation paid for each Clerk 2 of the Circuit Court, respectively, before July 1, 1989. (c) The Clerks of the Circuit Court, in counties in 3 4 which the population is 3,000,000 or less, shall be 5 compensated as follows: (1) Beginning December 1, 1989, base salary plus at 6 7 least 3% of base salary. Beginning December 1, 1990, base salary plus at 8 (2) 9 least 6% of base salary. (3) Beginning December 1, 1991, base salary plus at 10 11 least 9% of base salary. (4) Beginning December 1, 1992, base salary plus at 12 least 12% of base salary. 13 In addition to the compensation provided by the 14 (d) county board, each Clerk of the Circuit Court shall receive 15 16 an award from the State for the additional duties imposed by Sections 5-9-1 and 5-9-1.2 of Unified 17 the Code of Corrections, Section 10 of the Violent Crime Victims 18 19 Assistance Act, Section 16-104a of the Illinois Vehicle Code, and other laws, in the following amount: 20 21 (1) \$3,500 per year before January 1, 1997. 22 (2) \$4,500 per year beginning January 1, 1997. 23 \$5,500 per year beginning January 1, 1998. (3) \$6,500 per year beginning January 1, 1999. 24 (4) 25 The total amount required for such awards shall be appropriated each year by the General Assembly to the Supreme 26 which shall distribute such awards in annual lump sum 27 Court, payments to the Clerks of the Circuit Court in all counties. 28 29 This annual award, and any other award or stipend paid out of 30 State funds to the Clerks of the Circuit Court, shall not affect any other compensation provided by law to be paid to 31 32 Clerks of the Circuit Court.

For purposes of this subsection (e), "State correctional institution" means any facility of the Department of Corrections, including without limitation adult facilities, juvenile facilities, pre-release centers, community correction centers, and work camps.

16 (f) No county board may reduce or otherwise impair the 17 compensation payable from county funds to a Clerk of the 18 Circuit Court if the reduction or impairment is the result of 19 the Clerk of the Circuit Court receiving an award or stipend 20 payable from State funds.
